

ABOUT THE DANCE: This work, a collaboration of composer Paul Stuart and choreographer Alice Bloch, is dedicated to victims of the war in Bosnia and the countless, pointless, ethnic wars being fought around the world today. As we commemorate the anniversary of World War II, we remember the hideous destruction caused by ethnic hatred. We grieve at its persistence. We ask how it can be stopped. We turn to ourselves for the answer.

ABOUT THE TITLE: As composer Paul Stuart was working with his jeweller's torch, he saw a fly that had landed on his workbench fly backward into the flame. On inquiring about the fly's behavior, he discovered that flies, for all their speed and cunning, must achieve flight through an upward and backward trajectory. If there is a flame in its flight path, it will inevitably take flight directly into the flame and be incinerated. And each generation of flies, unable to learn from history, is doomed to repeat the same behavior.

ABOUT THE COMPOSER: Paul Stuart, a veteran singer/dancer of more than 1,500 professional performances, is uniquely qualified to understand the dancer's feel for music. He is resident composer of Gateway Ballet of St. Louis, and has composed sacred music for nationally touring and televised ensembles. He is proprietor of Paul Stuart Jeweller, Inc., and lives in St. Charles with his wife, Marcy, and their three children.
