


Letter from the President

Overview of Fiscal Year 2022

Thanks to the generosity of alumni and friends this fiscal year, Lindenwood celebrated the second-best fundraising year in its almost 200-year history. This year's total represents a 220 percent increase from the previous fiscal year. Within this year's total, nearly \$2 million was raised for scholarship aid including new awards in support of the proposed undergraduate nursing program, women studying cyber security and a full scholarship for the women's golf program.



We received gifts from 2,360 donors in FY22, representing a nearly 170 percent increase in donor count from the previous fiscal year.



965 Lindenwood alumni made their first gift to the University in FY22. This group accounts for over 55 percent of all new donors to Lindenwood this year.

Lindenwood supporters collectively contributed over \$6.3 million in FY22, making it the University's second-best fundraising year ever.



Lindenwood University raised more than \$125,000 during Giving Week 2022, surpassing its goal of raising \$100,000 and setting a new Giving Week fundraising record.

During the four-day celebration of philanthropy from March 23-26, the university received 428 gifts totaling \$125,825 from faculty, staff, students, alumni, and friends across 39 states. This represents a 277 percent increase in dollars raised, and a 139 percent increase in donors over last year's campaign.

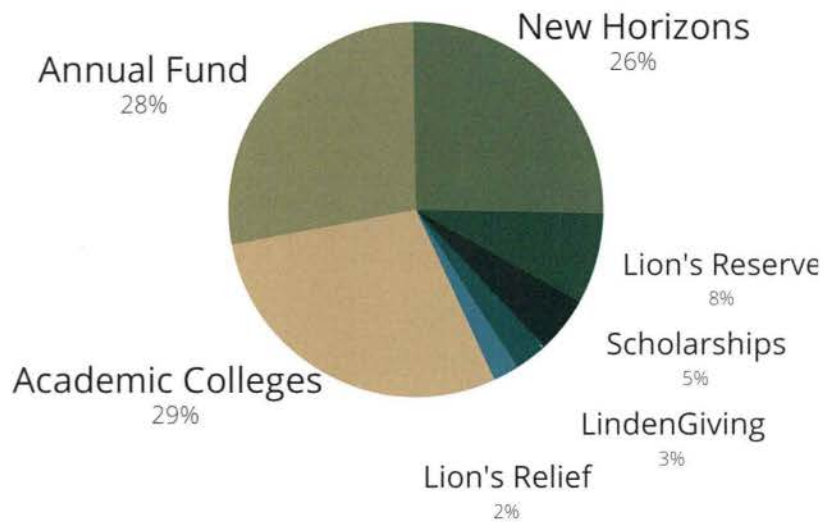

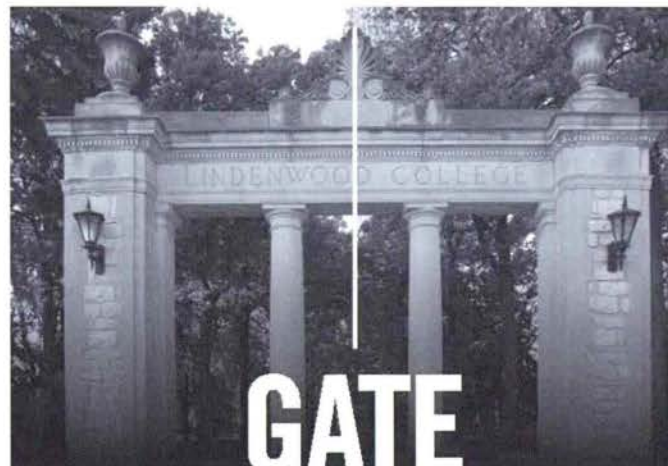
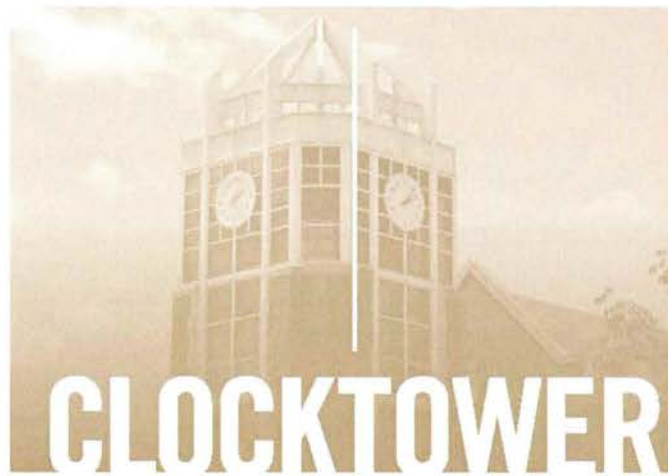
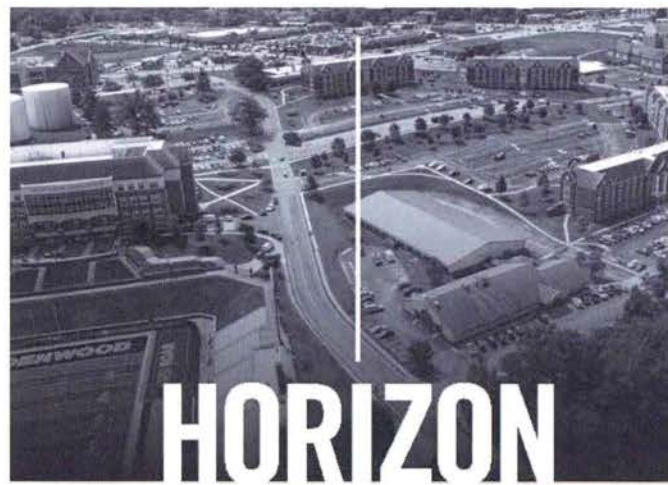
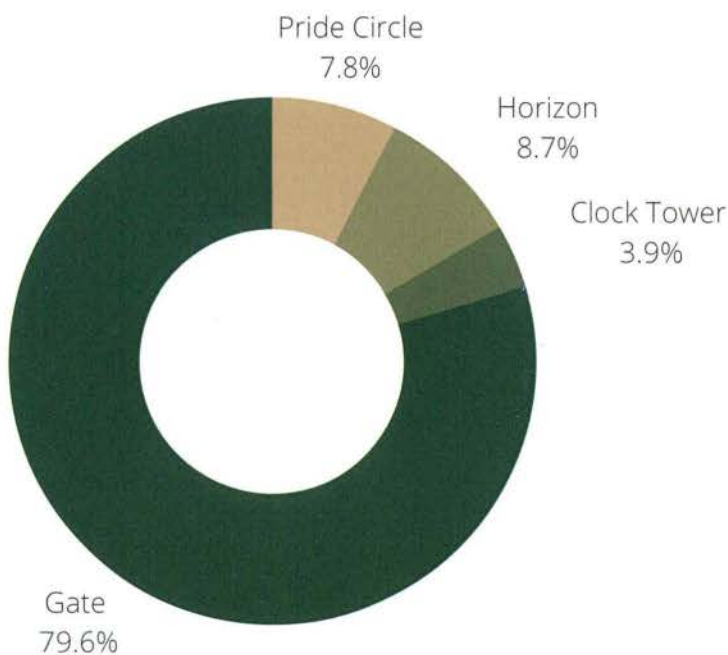
Total raised by members of the 1827
