PERFORMANCE

The Outstanding Teacher Education Award is given for service to the education department and the College, involvement in education activities, potential as a professional educator, and scholarship

CREATIVE LEADERSHIP

James D. Thompson Leadership Award
The award is given to a junior who has demonstrated leadership qualities in the College community in the area of clubs, newspaper, radio work, student government, service organizations, athletics, or other student programs. The primary criteria are demonstrated caring for and devotion to the Lindenwood Community
The President's Council Recognition of Special Merit
Awarded by vote of the President's Council, this recognition is made of a graduating senior who has made an outstanding contribution to the out of classroom life of the College
Sophie Wagner Urman Award
The Sophie Wagner Urman Award for Individual Accomplishment is given on an annual basis to a student who has shown outstanding individual accomplishment in any area. The recipient for this award possesses qualities of being a success in life
Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and CollegesMarilyn Morris
This is the 53rd year that Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges has recognized advanced undergraduates and graduate students at more than one thousand schools in every state, students who have been nominated by their campuses for outstanding scholastic achievement and contribution to community life

SCHOLARSHIP

Outstanding Member Award, Psychology Interest Group
This honor is presented to the member of the Psychology Interest Group who has given the most significant service to the Group during the current academic year
The F. Gilbert Bickel III Award
The F. Gilbert Bickel III award has been given to the outstanding business administration student for over a decade. This cash award is donated by Mr. Bickel, a prominent member of the St. Louis investment community and a former Adjunct Professor of Finance. The recipient, nominated by the faculty of the business administration department, is selected on the basis of grade point average and cocurricular departmental activities
Alpha Sigma Tau
Alpha Sigma Tau, founded at Lindenwood in 1922, annually honors graduating seniors who have demonstrated excellence in their studies. Those seniors achieving a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher are invited to membership
Alpha Lambda Delta
Alpha Lambda Delta is the national scholarship honor society for first year and new transfer students. Alpha Lambda Delta has recognized superior academic performance among entering college and university students since its inception at the University of Illinois in 1924. Lindenwood's chapter has been active since 1949
Jessie Bernard AwardEdith Graber
The Jessie Bernard Award in sociology/anthropology was established in 1984 to honor the internationally known sociologist who taught at Lindenwood from 1940-47. It is given to a senior sociology major for outstanding achievement in the sociology/anthropology department
Lindenwood was Professor Bernard's first teaching position after having completed her Ph.D. in sociology at Washington University. From here, she went to Pennsylvania State University, where she remained until her retirement from teaching. She is living in Washington, D.C. and working on her twenty-second book. Her pathbreaking studies of

marriage and family, women's roles, the sociology of race and community are among

her very significant scholarly contributions to her profession

Associates of The Fine Arts Award
An annual cash award is provided by Associates of The Fine Arts, a support group of the art department, given to a senior for outstanding performance in either art history or studio art
Harry D. Hendren Award
An annual cash award named for the late chairperson of the art department is given to a senior for outstanding performance in either art history or studio art
The Student Art Exhibition Annual Awards
Annual cash awards are provided by the Harry D. Hendren Memorial Fund and open to all students. Winners are selected at the time of the jurying of the Student Art Exhibition. The juror for this year's exhibition was Lindenwood alumna, Betsy Severson Nimock '55
Jana Rae Maddox Award
The Jana Rae Maddox Memorial Mathematics Award is given to the first year student who has demonstrated a combination of the greatest financial need and most promise for a career in mathematics (or a related science). This award is a memorial for Jana Rae Maddox (née Jana Rae Shimkus '73)
CRC Freshman Chemistry Award
The CRC Freshman Chemistry Award is presented annually at colleges and universities across the nation. At Lindenwood, the award is given to the student with the best performance in CHM 151-2, General Chemistry. The award consists of a certificate and a copy of the most recent edition of <i>The Handbook of Chemistry and Physics</i> published by CRC Publishing Company which sponsors the award. <i>The CRC Handbook of Chemistry and Physics</i> is recognized internationally and is used daily by scientists around the world
Russell Crider Pre-Health Professional ScholarshipJohn Bornmann/Mrs. Jane Crider
The Russell Crider Pre-Health Professional Scholarship honors the memory of Russell J. Crider, long time Lindenwood Board member and prominent St. Charles physician. The scholarship is awarded annually to a returning student who is studying toward a professional health career. Recipients also wish to continue their educations with post graduate health professional study
Outstanding Senior Communication Award
The Communications Department Scholastic Achievement Award is presented for outstanding academic performance and distinguished service in department activities

Anna Award Presented in memory of Anna Guttermuth, former housekeeper for the Memorial Arts Building and good friend of KCLC staff members, the award is made to a graduating senior for dedicated service to KCLC as well as for outstanding academic performance The James Magee II Memorial Scholarship honors the memory of James Magee II, who was a Lindenwood student from the Class of '88 majoring in performing arts. The student selected for this annual scholarship will be majoring in performing arts and working toward a career in this field of study St. Charles Kiwanis Renaissance Medal of Honor Scholarship.......Paul Orf The St. Charles Kiwanis Renaissance Medal of Honor Scholarship is sponsored by the St. Charles Kiwanis Club in conjunction with Lindenwood. This full-tuition annual scholarship is awarded to a student of the highest academic standards who has a proven commitment to active campus service and in the St. Charles community. The Scholarship is the highest academic and community service award that the club gives to a student Pi Mu Epsilon is a national fraternity whose purpose is the promotion of scholarly activity in mathematics and computer science. Its members are elected on an honorary basis according to their proficiency in mathematics and computer science, as shown by their performance in their undergraduate classes. A 3.5 grade point average in mathematics and/or computer science is required for membership To be selected as an NAIA Academic All-American, a student athlete must have a 3.3 cumulative grade point average at the time of nomination. Soccer nominees must demonstrate a high proficiency as a starter in 75% of the matches in the season of nomination. Only junior or senior players are eligible.
