- Wrestler, Terrell Wilbourn received his NCAA championship ring in a small ceremony at the Student-Athlete Center that included President Michael D. Shonrock. Wilbourn is the first wrestler to win a NCAA individual title, and he was the first wrestler in program history to have an undefeated season.
- **Gymnastics** received an award for having the 3rd highest GPA among every collegiate gymnastics program at the NCAA level.
- Women's Basketball had the 11th highest GPA among all three levels of NCAA women's basketball.

Fabian Florant, Men's Triple Jump. Monday, August 15 and Tuesday, August 16. Qualifying will take place at 7:30 a.m. on Monday, with the finals to follow on Tuesday at 7:50 a.m. Qualifying will be streamed on nbcolympics.com, with the finals aired live on NBC.



Fernando Reis, Men's 105 kg Weightlifting. Tuesday, August 16. The competitors will be split into two groups, the first competing at 1:30 p.m. and the second competing at 5 p.m. The group stage will be streamed at nbcolympics.com, while the Gold Medal finals will be aired on NBC Late Night Encore between 8:00 p.m. and 9:30 p.m.



Donald Thomas, Men's High Jump. Sunday, August 14 and Tuesday, August 16. The event will begin at 6:30 p.m. with the competitors split into two groups for qualifying, with the top competitors moving on to Tuesday's finals. Qualifying will be aired on nbcolympics.com, while the finals will be aired live on NBC.



Lindenwood Alumna **Morgan Craft** is a highly ranked skeet shooter for the U.S. In 2015, she established herself as a top women's skeet

shooter in the world, winning the skeet world title. In the shoot off for the Olympic bronze medal, Morgan came up short, finishing in 5th place.



Hidilyn Diaz, 25, earned the silver medal in the 53kg category of women's weightlifting. It was the first Olympic medal an athlete from the Philippines has won in 20 years. Hidilyn expected to be moving onto the Lindenwood University campus next week in anticipation of starting classes during the fall semester, but instead of taking notes in class this fall, she'll be taking a victory tour of her home country, complete with a visit with its leader.
