Our initial research indicated that the university was paying too much for the broker and the WC insurance. We solicited bids for both. We achieved a cost savings, and an increased focus on the health and safety of our employees. This will be accomplished by having our vendor complete a safety audit and provide training programs based upon the findings. This added focus on safety was included in our costs.

- The Missouri School Board Association (MSBA) Conference and Missouri Association of School Administrators (MASA) Conference was held September 29 – October 2. Over two dozen conference presenters were graduates from and affiliates (instructors) of Lindenwood University.
- The start of the new **Trimester IT Graduate Program** will be delayed until January 9, 2017 rather than starting on November 14, and classes will meet on the second Saturday of each month. More than 50 new graduate students have been accepted into the program, which is a very exciting start. However, most of the new students have not been able to secure a student visa from India in a timely manner. Rather than start in November with a small cohort, we decided it would be best if we delay the start until January.
- **Sorority and Fraternity** recruitment is on the rise. There are currently 200 Sorority women on campus, and currently 107 Fraternity men on campus.
- Men's Rugby Finished Third at the Global Red Bull Uni 7's Finals in Bath, England September 17, amassing a 4-2 record against some of the top collegiate teams in the world.

- The Lindenwood University **2016 United Way** campaign has officially begun! During the campaign, the goal is to raise \$18,270 (Lindenwood was founded in 1827) for service organizations in our region.
- President Michael and Karen Shonrock held a reception for the **Honors College** students. Over 100 students, family, and friends attended the reception.
- The Lindenwood **Men's Soccer** team defeated the Southwest Baptist Bearcats by a final score of 5-0 on Sunday, September 25 from Hunter Stadium in St. Charles, Missouri.
