Single mothers program receives gift from SBC Foundation

The Lindenwood University Single Mothers Program has received a \$5,000 donation from the Southwestern Bell Foundation. The Single Mothers Program provides a safe haven and stable environment for women with young children while they pursue a college education at LU, helping them prepare for employment, family leadership and service to society.

The program was established in 1990. More than 80 single mothers from the program have graduated. The ages of the mothers range from 18 to 25, but the program has served women as young as 17 and as old as 30. The majority of the women in the program are referred to the program trough University affiliated network social and religious organizations in the St. Charles County and St. Louis County area.

According to Craig Felzien, regional director of external affairs at Southwestern Bell and member of the Lindenwood University Board of Directors, the SBC Foundation has distributed hundreds of millions of dollars through grants, United Way support and employee outreach efforts since its founding in 1984. As the philanthropic arm of SBC Communications Inc., the Foundation is a private foundation, funded by SBC and its family of companies.

"We're grateful to the Southwestern Bell Foundation for supporting this worthwhile program," said Lindenwood President Dennis Spellmann.
