- We are pleased to report that the proposal for a new **General Education Curriculum** has been APPROVED by a vote of the faculty. Faculty Council bylaws require that such initiatives be approved by more than 50% of the faculty. There were 292 full-time faculty qualified to vote; 192 did so, representing a quorum. Of those 192, 159 voted to APPROVE the proposed GE curriculum, and 33 voted to REJECT the curriculum. Therefore, with an 83% majority, the motion carries.
- Students in the Marketing for Nonprofit Organizations class at Lindenwood University worked with **Kids Against Hunger**, a humanitarian food-aid-organization to package food on October 14 and 15 for hungry and starving children all over the world. Lindenwood student **Estevenson Coleman**, a member of the group

promoting the cause, grew up in an orphanage in Haiti, sometimes eating the meals from Kids Against Hunger. "I remember getting excited when this food was delivered," Coleman said. "It used to be just food to me, but now I get to see how people give their time and effort. I feel like I'm giving back."
