Your compensation as Agent to the Factory at the Osage river will be eight Hundred dollars a year Salary and three hundred sixty five dollars annually in lieu of subsistence, with an allowance of two hundred dollars as an outfit for the purchase of domestic utensils and twenty five dollars annually for the same purpose after the first year.
