LCIE TO OPEN WEST COUNTY GRADUATE CENTER

On September 1, the LCIE will open its West County Graduate Center in Manchester to serve working adults in the Ballwin, Ellisville and Manchester areas of western St. Louis County. The facility is located in the Education Annex of St. Luke's Episcopal Church, 1101 Sulphur Springs Rd., just north of Big Bend Blvd.

According to Arlene Taich, Ph.D., LCIE dean, a variety of programs will be offered this fall at the new center, including those leading to the Executive Master's in Business Administration degree; the Master's of Science in Administration, with an emphasis in finance, management or marketing; and the Master's of Science in Health Administration.

Next month, LCIE admission representatives will be available during evening hours at the West County Graduate Center to answer questions on LCIE programs and degrees. In the meantime, those interested in finding out more about fall programs at the new facility can contact Miriam King-Watts, director of adult admissions, at extension #209, or Dr. Taich at extension #384.

READING CENTER TO OFFER DIAGNOSTIC, TUTORIAL SERVICES

Diagnostic and tutorial reading services will once again be offered to elementary school children this fall by the Lindenwood College Reading Center. For children in kindergarten through eighth grade, the center will provide these services after normal school hours, from 4-6 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursdays, September 20-December 8 and January 24-April 26, 1984. Under the supervision of Diane Denney-Myers, assistant professor of education, the program is for students who are deficient in reading or those who want to improve their reading and study skills.

Lindenwood will work closely with schools and agencies in St. Charles County to coordinate information and services. "We will accept referrals directly from parents, but information and cooperation from the school and teachers are necessary to provide meaningful instruction which will transfer into long-term improvement in the classroom," she said. The scheduling of students and tutors must be completed by September 9, so parents are advised to make appointments for their children early.
