## MEET MRS. ETHEL M. NASH

Mrs. Nash was born in England, coming to this country in 1939 with her husband, Dr. Arnold Nash, who is Professor of the History of Religion at the University of North Carolina. They have two sons, aged 22 and 16.

Mrs. Nash did undergraduate and graduate work at the University of Liverpool in the field of modern history and social theory. She received a Didactic Analysis from Dr. Grace Calver of the Institute of Medical Development, then took an M. A., specializing in the field of Counseling and Guidance at the University of North Carolina.

The positions Mrs. Nash has occupied include that of Child Psychologist to the Toronto City Schools and Lecturer for the Association for Family Living in Chicago. During the years 1949-53 she was Marriage Counselor at the University of North Carolina, and lecturer in the field of Marriage and the Family in the Department of Sociology. Mrs. Nash is a member of the American Association of Marriage Counselors and has a private marriage counseling practice. She is a member of the Board of Directors of the National Council of Family Relations, and former President of North Carolina Family Life Council. She is on the faculty of the Bowman Gray School of Medicine as a Family Life Specialist, and Chairman of the Southeastern section of AAMC.

Mrs. Nash is well-known as a lecturer in both the United States and Canada. She has spoken at student and professional conferences from coast to coast. The universities and colleges at which she has lectured include Vassar College, Iowa State Teachers' College, Oklahoma College for Women, Bowman Gray Medical School, and Kentucky State College, and the universities of Nebraska, Wyoming, Tennessee, Kentucky, South Carolina, and Southern California. During the academic year 1953-54, under a grant from the Harvard-Yenching Foundation, she lectured in the universities of India, and subsequently in Burma, Thailand, and Japan.

Mrs. Nash was a contributor to the symposium Education for Christian Marriage (Macmillan) and to numerous periodicals. She is the author of With This Ring (Association Press) and of a pamphlet, "Marriage, A Christian Perspective," published by the Forward Movement of the Episcopal Church.
