Title: Agreeableness and COVID-19 Safety Protocols

INTRO:

The coronavirus pandemic has been raging on for almost 2 years and has changed the world dramatically. I wondered why certain people would or would not comply with safety protocols. Did their personality trait, agreeableness, have a hand in their behavior? Is one political party more apt to follow safety protocols then another? Is there a difference between men and women and their rate of compliance?

METHODS

- 1. Created survey on Qualtrics
- 2. Collected demographic information, agreeableness scale, and safety
 protocol scale from an online
 population
- Used independent t-test for correlation between agreeableness and COVID-19 safety protocols.

RESULTS

- There is no significance between the rate of compliance and agreeableness
- Democrats on average scored higher in agreeableness than Republicans
- Women scored higher on compliance ratings than men

Women are more likely than men to comply with COVID-19 safety protocols.

On average, Democrats are **more** agreeable than Republicans.


Below are my findings on women v men on compliance with safety protocols (figure 1) and average agreeableness rating between Democrats and Republicans (figure 2).


