Welcome to a time when innovation was occurring and the industrial revolution was in full swing, but the poorest of the poor couldn't even be described as barely scraping by. A time when corruption was rampant, as people struggled desperately to feed themselves and their families. A time when the police and other government employees were often as reviled as the criminals they opposed. In short, welcome to Victorian England.

Queen Victoria's London was very much a dog eat dog world. It was a world in which thieves and other criminals could gain a measure of fame. Jack Sheppard, the original inspiration for Macheath, was a burglar who gained notoriety in the 1720s for escaping prison a number of times. The inspiration for Mr. Peachum, Jonathan Wild, earned the moniker Thief Taker General by organizing a criminal network the likes of which London had never seen. Both of these men were eventually captured and hung, but not before gaining the notoriety and fame that ensured their place in history.

Though set in Victorian England, *Threepenny Opera* also serves as a reflection of the times Brecht found himself in. First performed in 1928 (and based on John Gay's *Beggar's Opera*), Brecht's show was written in a very similar socio-political climate. The Weimar Republic was in dire straits economically, led by a widely reviled government, and filled with people who were starving in the streets, just like 1870s London.

It is on these foundations of misery that we find ourselves in the delightfully twisted story that is Brecht's *Threepenny Opera*. And while that misery is reflected in the lives of our characters, never fear: you'll find yourself laughing, whether you mean to or not.
