

NCAA Women's Frozen Four

Lindenwood University, in partnership with the St. Louis Sports Commission and the Family Arena, hosted the NCAA Women's Frozen Four which is the national championship for women's ice hockey. The event featured Minnesota, Wisconsin, Boston College, and Clarkson and was the first ever NCAA National Championship hosted in St. Charles.

Events included a participant banquet with over 650 people at the Scheidegger Center on Thursday, semi-final games on Friday, the Patty Kazmaier Award Ceremony Saturday morning at the Foundry Center for the Arts. The championship game on Sunday was televised on the Big 10 Network and broadcast live for the first time ever. Clarkson defeated Wisconsin in front of 3,016 fans to win their second national title in four years.
