Lindenwood's College of Education and Human Services (COEHS) has signed a partnership agreement with the Endeavor STEM Teaching Certificate Project on January 20, 2023. The College of Education and Human Services students will soon be able to take Endeavor STEM courses online as part of the Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction.

The Endeavor STEM Teaching Certificate Project brings a unique collaboration with the NASA Office of STEM Engagement, whereby researchers from NASA missions interact with educators online and share their work and mission data.


The COEHS Takes over the VIP Room During the Women's and Men's Basketball Game




Amber was asked about her experience within the COEHS. Her response is below:

Are you seeking completion of a teaching certification? If so, please reach out to

DESE updates:

- The Missouri State Highway Patrol (HP) now allows individuals to request that fingerprint results be sent to up to five districts. This just became effective and the cost is \$50. However, HP does not allow individuals to register on its MACHS site for multiple districts by entering multiple codes. A different set of procedures must now be used.

Cuivre River Electric Scholarships

Cuivre River Electric Cooperative (CREC) is once again accepting scholarship <u>online applications</u> from current college students. The deadline is April 14, 2023!

CREC serves its members across 5 counties: St. Charles, Lincoln, Warren, Pike, and Montgomery. Students are eligible to be considered if they live in the Cuivre River Electric service area and maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 while attending undergraduate courses at an accredited college,

university, or technical school. Applicants are required to provide an official transcript and two letters of recommendation, a complete copy of their Student Aid Report (SAR), write a narrative to highlight their academic achievements and community service, state their career goals and demonstrate a financial need. The scholarship may also be used for adult continuing education courses in an applicant's career field.

In 2022, a total of \$85,500 was awarded, with 86 students receiving a scholarship. The Trust Board has awarded 2,556 scholarships totaling over \$1.4 million since 1997.
