Scheduled performances include Igor Kipnis, called "the foremost harpsichordist of the day," in concert October 30 at 3 p.m. in the Lindenwood College Chapel; a virtuoso performance by Trio Cassatt at 3 p.m. November 6; the Joffrey II Dancers at 7 p.m. on January 25; the well-known musical duo, Jasmine, 7:30 p.m. March 8; and the contemporary jazz group, the David Hines Ensemble, 3 p.m. March 25. The season ticket price represents a 25% savings from individual admission charges of \$4 for each event.

composed of members of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra. The concert by Kipnis will feature selections from the 16th and 18th centuries as well as renditions of jazz, rag and rock music. Student tickets can be obtained free of charge at the Box Office in Roemer Hall.

CLASSROOM SMOKING PROHIBITED

Effective immediately, a recommendation approved by the President's Council calls for smoking to be prohibited in all instructional rooms on campus. Faculty, staff and students are expected to both enforce and adhere to the smoking ban. Smokers may continue to utilize noninstructional areas, hallways, corridors and outside areas.

BOOK ORDERS DUE FOR SPRING SEMESTER

A reminder from Gene Goldstein that all book orders from faculty members must be submitted by October 31 for spring semester texts. Goldstein also asks that faculty members notify the Bookstore on which books currently being used this semester can be returned for refunds from publishing firms.

STUDENT PARKING PROHIBITED IN THREE LOTS

During daytime hours, student parking is prohibited in lots adjacent to Roemer Hall, the Memorial Arts Building and the Young Hall of Science. The three lots are reserved for faculty and staff parking. Security Chief Duane France reports that signs soon will be posted at the three lots, and tickets will be issued to all student violators.

MISSOURI PLAYWRIGHT TO APPEAR FRIDAY

Frank Higgins of Kansas City will present a stage reading of his drama, THE SWEET BYE AND BYE, Friday at 4 and 8 p.m. in the MAB. The free event is sponsored by the Department of Performing Arts and is funded in part by a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities for staging original Missouri plays throughout the state. Faculty members are encouraged to have their students attend. An informal discussion will follow the stage reading.

RAPE PREVENTION SEMINAR OCTOBER 26

"Rape - What It Is and How To Avoid It" is the title of a rape prevention seminar scheduled October 26 at 7:30 p.m. in Young Hall Auditorium. Open to both men and women, this free campus and community event is cosponsored by Lindenwood College and the St. Charles Jaycee Women.

The seminar speaker is Nancy Hightshoe, a former officer with the St. Louis County Police Dept. who served as a detective with the Rape Squad. During her more than three years with the force, she made more than 125 felony sex crime arrests that resulted in court cases with convictions totaling more than 1,000 years of jail sentences. Since 1975, she has been counseling victims of sexual abuse and conducting community programs on the understanding and prevention of rape. Her seminars have been acclaimed by both men and women as sensitive, articulate examinations of a serious problem in America today. At next week's seminar, she will not only demonstrate resistance techniques that can be effective in a rape situation, but she also will show women how to make themselves and their homes safer from potential attacks.
