'RELIGION IN AMERICA' LECTURE SERIES

A series of three lectures on "Religion in America" will be offered at Lindenwood next month by St. Louis area theologians. Rabbi Bruce Diamond, Monsignor John Shocklee and the Rev. Robert McGruther will discuss Judaism, Catholicism and Protestantism, respectively, November 3, 10 and 17 at 7:30 p.m. in the MAB. The lectures, open to all free of charge, will be offered in conjunction with the course, "Religion in America," taught by Aaron Miller, Ph.D., dean of faculty and provost.

Rabbi Diamond, is head of the Congregation Kol Am and president of the St. Louis Rabbinical Association. Monsignor Shocklee, director of the Office of Human Rights of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, is a well-known speaker in the metropolitan area. The Rev. McGruther, pastor of St. Charles Presbyterian Church, is a frequent contributor to college activities.

SPAINHOWER TO ATTEND FIRST APCU MEET

President James I. Spainhower is among leaders of 71 colleges and universities in the country invited to attend the first meeting of the newly-formed Association of Presbyterian Colleges & Universities (APCU), scheduled November 6-8 in Memphis, TN. The APCU is composed of institutions related to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), the recently-merged organization of the Presbyterian Church of the U.S. and the United Presbyterian Church U.S.A. A committee representing both groups has been working more than a year to plan the formation of the APCU. In addition to presidents of colleges and universities, representatives of the 19 synods of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) also have been invited to the meeting.
