the calendar.




Lacrosse Prepares for Fourth Consecutive National Semifinal

The Baseball team <u>ended the regular season with a 7-4 win</u> over Pittsburg State at the Lou Brock Sports Complex in St. Charles, MO.




Feldmann Named MIAA Pitcher of the Week


Hensley Named To Women's Hockey National Team
