LINDENWOOD ENROLLMENT TOTALS 1,836

Total enrollment at Lindenwood College in St. Charles and its off-campus locations is 1,836 students, a 7.5 percent decrease from the all-time record of 1,985 students a year ago. This fall's enrollment consists of 1,095 part-time students and 741 full-time ones. Broken down, the 1,836 figure represents 854 students enrolled in the Evening College and off-campus locations, 431 full-time day students, 296 students in LCIE, 172 graduate students on campus, 69 part-time day students and 14 students enrolled in the ESL program.
