Note: The first factory for radium paining opened in 1917 in Orange, New Jersey. The Radium Girls were female factory workers who suffered radiation poisoning at sites in New Jersey, Illinois, and Connecticut while painting watch dials with the self-luminous paint. Women, thinking the paint was harmless, obliged when they were told to "point" their brushes on their lips to reinforce a fine point. They were amused that their work clothes would glow in their closets at night. The Radium Girls' saga holds an important place in the history of both the fields of health science and the labor rights movement.

CHOREOGRAPHER BIOGRAPHIES

Betsy Brandt is an interdisciplinary dance artist, teacher, and dramaturg. She currently holds faculty appointments at Webster and Lindenwood Universities, teaching courses in history, composition, and technique. Her dramaturgical work includes collaborations with Kate Corby, Sara Hook, Paul Matteson, Jennifer Monson, Elizabeth Johnson, and Tere O'Connor. Her scholarship has been presented at the Congress on Research in Dance, the Lorado Taft Lectureship Series, and the inaugural Dance Writing Lab at the National Center for Choreography. Brandt serves on the Board of Directors for Leverage Dance Theater and the Artist Advisory Board for The Luminary. She earned her MFA in dance from University of Illinois: Urbana Champaign.

Tracy Dupre has been an Adjunct Dance Professor at Lindenwood University for 14 years. She has a cross-disciplinary focus in dance and digital media and teaches tap, jazz and dance theory and composition. She served as Tap Dance Coordinator at COCA (Center of Creative Arts) for ten years where she taught tap, jazz and choreographed for the COCAdance Dance Company, COCAbiz and COCAcabana. Her training was with the Performing Arts Centre where she was a member of the Dance Company of St. Charles. Tracy studied modern dance, musical theatre. West African dance, ballet, choreography and video production at Stephens College. She has earned a Bachelors degree in TV & Video Production, a Master of Arts in Mass Communication & Digital Media and has completed coursework for her Master of Fine Arts in Dance. In 2013, Tracy earned the Adjunct Teaching Award at Lindenwood University. She choreographs for corporate events and dance companies, teaches dance intensives, master classes and has taught at the American College Dance Festival. She has judged regional & national dance competitions and her choreography has won national titles and choreography awards. Choreography credits include the Bob Costas charity event, 60x60 Project, Spring to Dance Festival, Dancing In the Street, St. Louis Bilikens basketball team, St. Louis Panera Bread Company, the opening act for a Bobby McFerrin concert as well as a Love & Unity town hall event here at Lindenwood. Tracy has been interviewed by Dancer Magazine regarding the tap dance scene in St. Louis. She has danced in the Cotton Bowl Parade and attends National Tap Dance Festivals around the country where she has studied & taken class from Jason Samuels Smith. Chloe Arnold. Sarah Reich. Diane Walker, Arthur Duncan, Bril Barrett, Michelle Dorrance, Lane Alexander, Diane Walker, Brenda Bufalino, Acia Gray, Savion Glover, Sam Weber, Henry Le Tang, Van Porter and many more. Professional organizations include the Missouri Dance Organization (MDO), the International Tap Dance Association (ITA), the Wedding & Event Videographers Association (WEVA) and the St. Louis Videographers Association (SLVA).

Amy Gammon was raised and trained in St. Louis, Missouri, where she holds a strong passion for dance, teaching, and choreography. She has been on faculty with Performing Arts Centre for eight years teaching tap, lyrical, jazz & hip hop. She holds a BA in Dance from Lindenwood University and a Master of Arts in Teaching with an emphasis on Dance. Amy has taught for The American College Dance Association, Tap The Map, and Greater St. Louis Cecchetti Committee. She has also set choreography for several area dance teams, and is also an Adjunct Professor at Lindenwood University. Ms. Gammon is a member of Dance Masters, a fourth-year attendee at DMA's Teachers Training School earning the Bachna Scholarship, and serves on the board of directors for The DANCE CO of St. Charles. Amy shares a true passion for the art of teaching dance, along with the creativeness behind choreography.

Courtney Krachtus, of Chicago, Illinois, is currently a student at Lindenwood University, pursuing a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Dance. Her training and passion for dance began at the age of 10 at a studio in Montgomery, Illinois under the direction of Catie Deitz-Griffith. While at Lindenwood University, she has continued her pursuit of performance through both the Dance Program and 7-Time National Champion Lion Line Dance Team (2014-2016). Professor Strzelec has an extensive history of teaching, directing and choreographing in the greater St. Louis area including work with dance studios, high schools, and professional dance and musical theatre companies. Her performance credits include ballets, musicals, dinner theatre, television commercials and Six Flags Productions. Some of Professor Strzelec's favorite roles are Adelaide (Guys and Dolls), Anna (The Kind and I), Roxie (Chicago), and dancing as a "Friend" and a "Wili" in her favorite ballet--Giselle.

Tiala Taylor is now in her junior year at Lindenwood University. She is pursuing her BFA in Dance with an emphasis in contemporary. Tricia Zweier is an educator, choreographer, and performer with a crossdisciplinary interest in dance and kinesiology. After earning a Master of Science in Kinesiology and a Master of Fine Arts in Dance from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, she relocated to Missouri and is in her seventh year as an Assistant Professor of Dance teaching mostly contemporary and jazz techniques, dance history, dance & technology, and dance science courses. Outside of LU, Tricia has been invited to teach master classes in Illinois, Missouri, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Texas. She has also completed residencies as a guest artist at The Center for Contemporary Dance Preprofessional Student Intensive (Orlando, FL), The College of Lake County (Grayslake, IL) and Texas Tech University (Lubbock, TX). Tricia performed with the Atlantic City Ballet (formerly Atlantic Contemporary Ballet Theatre) and Flatlands Dance Theatre, as well as international tours in the cruise line industry as a lead dancer and dance captain. She has also had the pleasure of working with more contemporary artists including Sean Curran, Mark Dendy, and Nejla Yatkin. Most recently, she was a National's judge for America's National Dance Championships, set an original work on Modern American Dance Company (MADCO) for their 40th Anniversary Season, and was accepted to present choreography in The Boston Contemporary Dance Festival. Tricia is the Operations Coordinator for The Dance Science and Somatics Educators. She is also a member of The Congress on Research in Dance. The National Dance Education Organization, and The International Association of Dance Medicine and Science.
