CHOREOGRAPHER BIOGRAPHIES

Tracy Dupre has been an Adjunct Dance Professor at Lindenwood University for 13 years. She has a cross-disciplinary focus in dance and digital media and teaches tap, iazz and dance theory and composition. She served as Tap Dance Coordinator at COCA (Center of Creative Arts) for ten years where she taught tap, jazz and choreographed for the COCAdance Dance Company, COCAbiz and COCAcabana. Her training was with the Performing Arts Centre where she was a member of the Dance Company of St. Charles, Tracy studied modern dance, musical theatre, West African dance and ballet at Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri. She has earned a Bachelor Degree in TV & Video Production, Master of Arts in Mass Communication & Digital Media and has completed coursework for her Master of Fine Arts in Dance. In 2013. Tracv earned the Adjunct Teaching Award at Lindenwood University. She choreographs for corporate events and dance companies, teaches intensives, master classes and has taught at the American College Dance Festival. She has judged regional dance competitions and her choreography has won national titles and choreography awards. Her choreography credits include the Bob Costas charity event, 60x60 Project, Spring to Dance Festival, Dancin' In the Streets, St. Louis Bilikens basketball team, St. Louis Panera Bread Company, the opening act for a Bobby McFerrin concert as well as Lindenwood's Love & Unity townhall event. In 2009, Tracy was interviewed by Dancer Magazine regarding the tap dance scene in St. Louis. She has danced in the Cotton Bowl Parade and attends National Tap Dance Festivals around the country where she has studied under Jason Samuels Smith, Chloe Arnold, Sarah Reich, Diane Walker, Arthur Duncan, Bril Barrett, Lane Alexander, Diane Walker, Brenda Bufalino, Acia Grav. Savion Glover, Sam Weber, Henry Le Tang, Van Porter and many more. Tracy is also the owner of Brookstone Video where she combines her passion for dance and digital media. Professional organizations include the Missouri Dance Organization (MDO). the International Tap Dance Association (ITA), the Wedding & Event Videographers Association (WEVA) and the St. Louis Videographers Association (SLVA).

Maddison Eilers is pursuing a Bachelors of Arts degree in Dance and plans to graduate this spring. This is her second piece that she has choreographed here at Lindenwood University. She has choreographed for Mary Emily Bryan Middle School, for their musicals and choir performances for multiple years. Maddison has had the opportunity to perform here at Lindenwood in the dance concerts, as well as, Legally Blonde; The Musical in 2015. Outside of Lindenwood, Maddison has performed at Six Flags St. Louis in their summer and fall shows since 2010.

Amy Gammon is raised and trained in St. Louis, Missouri, where she holds a strong passion for dance, teaching, and choreography. She has been on faculty with Performing Arts Centre for 7 years teaching tap, lyrical, jazz & hip hop. Ms.

Gammon holds a BA in Dance from Lindenwood University and a Master's of Arts in Teaching with an emphasis on Dance. Amy has taught for Tap The Map, Lindenwood University, Greater St. Louis Cecchetti Committee, assisted Anthony Russo at 24/7 Dance Convention, has set choreography for several area dance teams and is also an Adjunct Professor at Lindenwood University. She has taught at local dance studios as a guest artist in areas of tap and hip hop. Ms. Gammon is a member of Dance Masters, a fourth year attendee at DMA's Teachers Training School, on the judging panel with Beyond The Stars, and serves on the board of directors for The DANCE CO. of St. Charles. Amy shares a true passion for the art of teaching dance, along with the creativeness behind choreography.

Lindsey Kellen, a Colorado native, is a Senior at Lindenwood University who is pursuing a Bachelors of Arts degree in dance. While at Lindenwood, Lindsey is also advancing her knowledge of costume construction and design by working as a stitcher in the J. Scheidegger Center for the Arts' costume shop. Prior to attending LU, Lindsey attended Pikes Peak Community College in Colorado Springs. While at PPCC, she was a senior member of the performance company High Altitude Dance Ensemble, a touring group that performs around the state for various events. Lindsey is trained in various styles of dance and partner work such as jazz, ballet, tap, modern/contemporary, and musical theatre. She is also a reoccurring guest choreographer for Liberty High School, where she graduated in 2013. Lindsey has also been an actress in various film work for Cyclops Films, and is a published author for the website U.S. Represented. Post graduation Lindsey plans to return to Colorado Springs where she will be the color guard instructor for Doherty High School as well as continuing her dancing and choreographic career.

Julia Leslie was born in Woodbury, Minnesota. She began dancing in 1999 when she was four years old at Woodbury Dance Center. She participated in recreational dance until she was 11 then joined the competitive dance team in 2005 and participated in that until she graduated from high school in 2013. Julia plans to graduate May 2017 with a Bachelor of Arts in Dance. She is currently teaching dance in St. Charles, Missouri at UT Collaboration, as well as Performing Arts Centre, Inc. She has trained in tap, jazz, contemporary, lyrical, ballet and pom. This will be her first time choreographing for a Lindenwood production and she is very excited for people to see her work.

Haley Lindquist (O'Fallon, IL) is a senior at Lindenwood University where she is a candidate for a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Dance and is expected to graduate in May of 2017. After graduation, Haley is excited for wherever her career may take her while continuing her focus on her passion of performance and choreography.

Taylor Plodzien is a senior at Lindenwood University. She will be graduating this May with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Dance with an emphasis in Ballet and a minor in marketing. She has danced with 42nd street original, Tony Parisi, has taken instruction from many famous tappers including Chloe Arnold and Jason Samuels Smith and has personally worked with Valerie Rockey, Gregory Fuller, Anthony Russo, Nicholas Young, and Mark Goodman. She enjoys teaching, choreographing, and sharing her passion with her students. A tap piece she recently choreographed. "Chaplin," was nominated for 'Best Musical Theatre Routine' and taken to the Industry Dance Awards in Los Angeles, California in August of 2016. After completing her undergraduate degree, Miranda plans to pursue her Master's degree in Teaching Dance K-12th grade. She also plans to open her own studio or own her own Tap Company. Miranda's philosophy on life is to never tap out on your dreams.

Christa Williams is a senior candidate for the Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Dance at Lindenwood University. She studied dance, specifically contemporary, at various dance studios in Kansas and Illinois for 15 years. She serves as the artistic director of her own company. Christa Williams Choreography, and her choreographic experience includes many dance teams and studios throughout the state of Illinois. Highland Varsity Dance Team and Murphysboro Varsity Dance team have earned state-winning titles with her work in jazz and pom-dance, and The Mehlville Pantherettes earned 7th in the Nation at NDA Nationals with her Pom dance choreography. Along with choreography, Christa's company provides services in music editing and costume design. In 2015, she served as a member of Lindenwood's 6-time national championship Lion Line dance team and helped them earn their sixth national championship in jazz. Christa has been teaching jazz, contemporary, and hip hop at the studio level for 6 years, and is currently employed by On Your Toes Dance Studio in St. Louis. She also serves as Mehlville High School's Junior Varsity dance team coach. Christa is expected to graduate in 2017 and plans to further her education with a Masters of Fine Arts degree in dance and choreography.

Tricia Zweier is an educator, choreographer, and performer with a crossdisciplinary interest in dance and kinesiology. After earning a Master of Science in Kinesiology and a Master of Fine Arts in Dance from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, she relocated to Missouri and is in her sixth year as an Assistant Professor of Dance teaching mostly contemporary and jazz techniques, dance history, dance & technology, and dance science courses. Outside of LU, Tricia has been commissioned to teach master classes in Illinois, Missouri, New Jersev. Pennsylvania, and Texas. She has also completed residencies as a guest artist at The Center for Contemporary Dance Pre-professional Student Intensive (Orlando, FL), The College of Lake County (Grayslake, IL) and Texas Tech University (Lubbock, TX). Tricia performed with the Atlantic City Ballet (formerly Atlantic Contemporary Ballet Theatre) and Flatlands Dance Theatre, as well as international tours in the cruise line industry as a lead dancer and dance captain. Her modern dance performance credits include the works of Hanya Holm, Merce Cunningham, and Martha Graham. She has also had the pleasure of working with more contemporary artists including Sean Curran, Mark Dendy, and Nejla Yatkin. Most recently, was a National's judge for America's National Dance Championships, performed with Leverage Dance Theatre at Cottey College and set an original work on Modern American Dance Company (MADCO) for their 40th Anniversary Season. Tricia is the Operations Coordinator for The Dance Science and Somatics educators. She is also a member of The Congress on Research in Dance and The International Association of Dance Medicine and Science.
