ACADEMIC DRESS

The caps, gowns, and hoods worn by the faculty and students at this graduation are today's formal dress of the worldwide academic community. While now worn only on such festive occasions as commencement, such dress was originally the normal garb of academics as they went about their daily business. It originated in Europe more than a thousand years ago; like universities and colleges themselves, it developed within the church and all academics were once at least in minor orders within the Church. The robes and hoods are stylized versions of those monastic robes. The style of robe indicates the highest degree earned by the wearer — bachelor sleeves are pointed, and the robe is plain. Master's robe sleeves are oblong, while the doctoral robe sleeve is gathered at the wrist, and the robe itself has velvet bands. Another badge of the doctoral degree is a gold tassel worn on the cap.

The hoods indicate both the academic area of degree and the school which granted it. The outer band of the hood indicates, by color, the degree; the bright, silken interior of the hood, by its colors and design, indicates its source. Each university and college has a distinctive hood. An increasing number of doctorate granting universities today fashion their own doctoral robes, using institutional colors.

The colors of the mortarboard tassels worn by today's baccalaureate degree recipients, as well as the hoods worn by faculty, indicate the major fields of study.

Prior to receiving degrees, students wear their tassels on the right. Upon receipt of the degree, graduates move the tassel to the left to indicate their new status

THE MACE

The mace, carried in the academic procession by the Faculty Marshal, symbolizes the authority of the College's President. The mace is a staff of linden wood, surmounted by a silver cup, originally belonging to President Roemer. It is used only on occasions such as this one when the Faculty and its President march in formal procession. Since academic customs originated within the medieval Church, the order of procession follows ecclesiastical custom, with the most honored members of the procession at the end; thus the President, preceded by the Marshal, follows the other members of the academic community into the Commencement area

THE COLLEGE SEAL

The Lindenwood College seal, mounted on the Gazebo rostrum, was fashioned of stained glass by Professor of Art John Wehmer after his redesign of the family crest of College founders Mary and George Sibley. The seal is displayed regularly in the entrance way to the office of the President in Roemer Hall, and is centered on the college flag

HONORARY DEGREES

For centuries, colleges and universities have awarded honorary degrees to worthy recipients for institutional and societal contribution. These degrees, awarded *honoris causa* ("for honorable cause"), represent the College's most time-honored way to recognize significant service and achievement

COLLEGE HISTORY

Lindenwood College was founded in 1827 by Mary Easton (1800-78) and Major George C. Sibley (1782-1863). The institution was incorporated by the Missouri Legislature in 1853, making it America's second oldest college west of the Mississippi (St. Louis University was founded in 1818). The childless Sibleys deeded the College property to the Missouri Synod of the Presbyterian Church, a formal affiliation which lasted over a century. Today, fully independent, the College is in a covenantal relationship with the Presbyterian Church. The first commencement was held in 1858. Third and fourth years were added to the degree program in 1918. Evening and graduate programs were formed in 1972. Lindenwood became coeducational in 1969
