Pedraza, who will be entering her senior year, is one of 28 players named to the World Cup team and is the second youngest on the squad at the age of 20. The selection puts her among the top female players in the nation at any age.

Patterson-Mills Creates Blueprint for Illinois School Funding
Belleville Associate Professor and School Counseling Program

legislation that finally put an end to a two-year school funding crisis in the State of Illinois. The proposed new formula includes language requiring higher thresholds of staffing of guidance counselors, which was based on a white paper largely written by Patterson-Mills. A

#### **Carnes Publishes Book**

Geremy Carnes, Assistant Professor of English recently published his first monograph titled *The Papist Represented Literature and the English Catholic Community, 1688–1791*, demonstrates that far from being marginalized or ignored, the 18th Century English Catholic minority participated actively in the largely Protestant society and culture. In so doing, Carnes's book convincingly argues that, contrary to earlier literary histories of the period, eighteenth-century English literature is not a solely Protestant enterprise.



#### Romoero-Ghiretti to Publish with Journal

Gabriela Romero-Ghiretti, Associate Professor of Spanish and Chair of the Foreign Languages Department, was recently invited by two different academic journals to review an edited volume titled *New Readings of Silvina Ocampo: Beyond Fantasy.* Romero-Ghiretti chose to publish with Revista de Estudios Hispanicos, a leading Hispanic Studies academic journal founded at Washington University. The review will appear in the June 2018 issue of the journal.

#### Giuseffi Edits Book

Dr. Frank Giuseffi, an adjunct professor in the School of Education, recently edited <u>Emerging Self-Directed Learning Strategies in the Digital Age</u>. Three faculty members also contributed to the book with articles: Dr. John Long, Dr. Maria Orlando, and Dr. Ronda Cypret-Mahach.

## **We Support Our Houston Lions**


