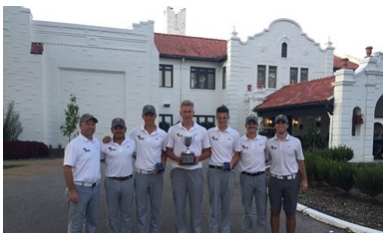
Football Plays Complete Game in Home Opener

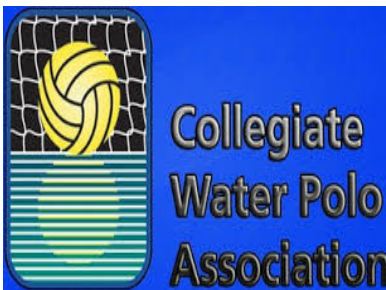

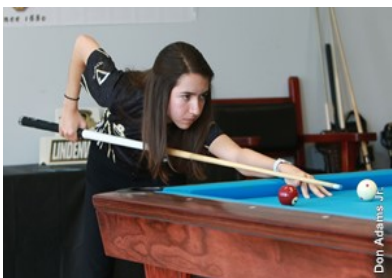
Men's Water Polo Maintains CWPA #1 Ranking

After the first two weeks of competition, men's water polo remains ranked #1 on the Collegiate Water Polo Association's National Collegiate Club polls!



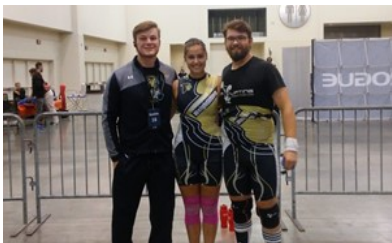
Shotgun Sports Team Begins Season with Victory

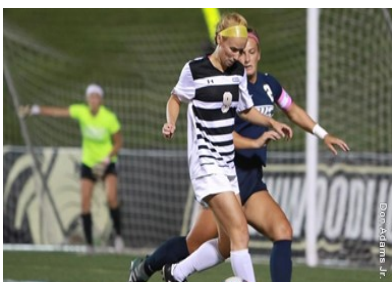
Andric Scores Twice, As Men's Soccer Snaps Three-Game Skid

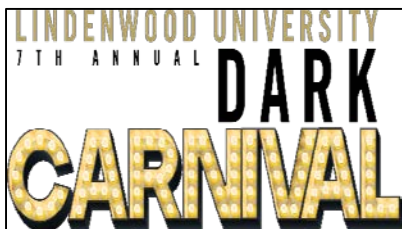
