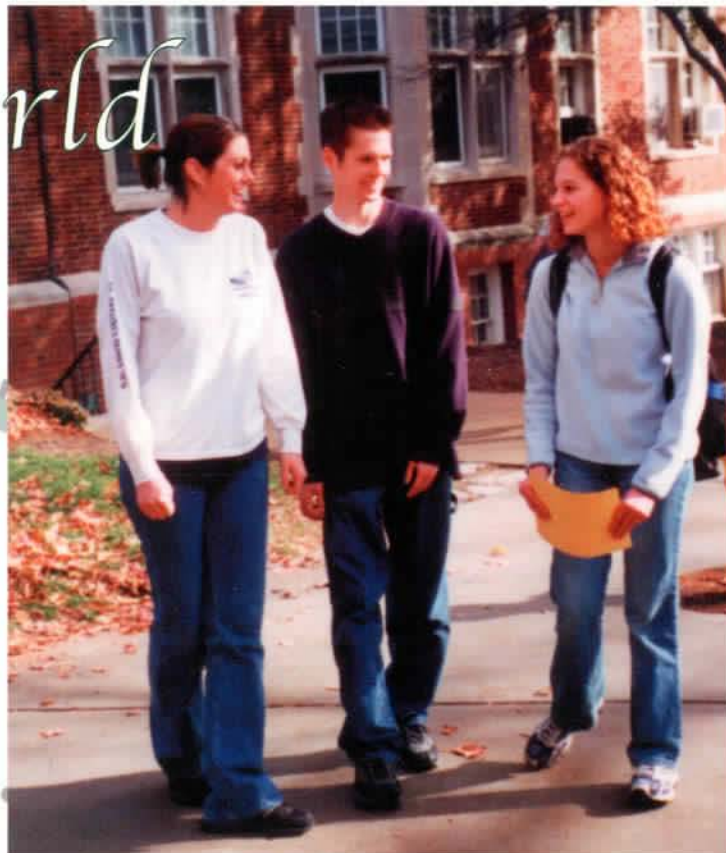

The main 400-acre residential campus is located in St. Charles, MO. Resting on the banks of the Missouri River, St. Charles is the site of Missouri's first state capitol.

Lindenwood is close to St. Louis, a city offering everything from professional sports—the Cardinals, the Rams, and the Blues—to an internationally recognized zoo. There are touring Broadway shows at the Fabulous Fox Theatre and the Muny Opera, as well as superstar concerts at the Savvis Center and Riverport Amphitheater. The University's oldest building, Sibley Hall, is a tribute to Lindenwood's founders George C. and Mary Easton Sibley. Built in 1860, it is listed in the National Register of Historic Places and serves as a women's residence hall. The University has a historical relationship with the

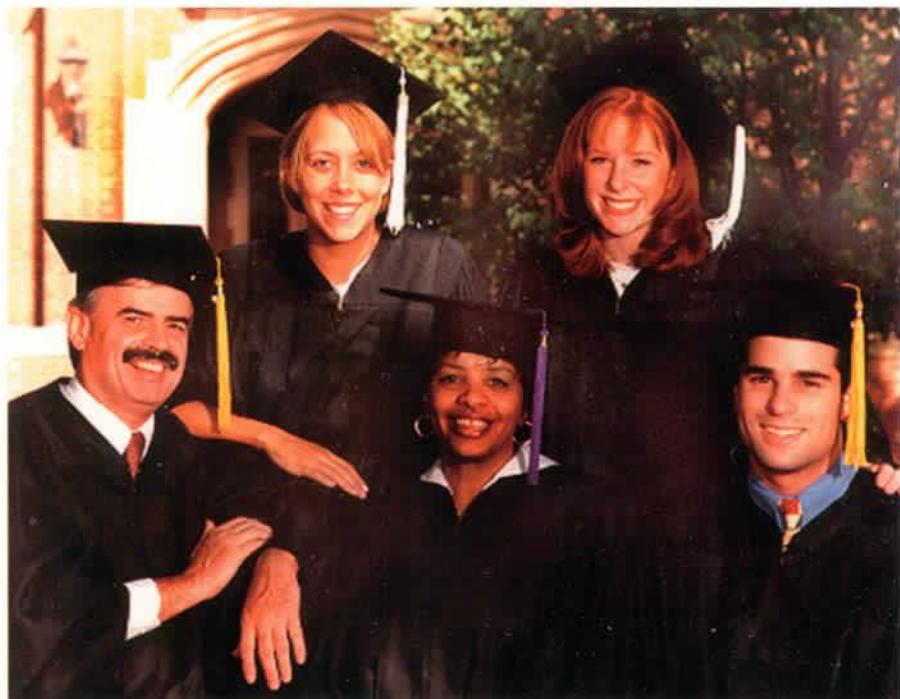

Real Challenges

Lindenwood University offers students the opportunity to participate in athletics.

The University's football, soccer and field hockey teams play in the Harlen C. Hunter Stadium, which has an artificial turf field and a seating capacity of 5,000. Newly refurbished softball and baseball fields and an all-weather outdoor track are located on the southwest corner of the campus. The Lindenwood basketball, volleyball and wrestling teams compete in the 3,000-seat Robert F. Hyland Performance Arena.

All students have complete access to the fully-equipped fitness center which includes free weights, weight and stair-step machines, stationary bicycles, an indoor track, and a combination wrestling/dance floor.



Lindenwood University has many activities and organizations for you to participate in.

As a Lindenwood University student, you are given many opportunities to become an active part of campus life. Activities are planned for both commuter and residential

students. Semi-formal and casual dances are held at the Lindenwood University Club on a regular basis. A variety of social activities are designed to allow students the chance to relax and meet others.

Other extracurricular activities offer you hands-on experience in a particular field. You can host a radio show, work on a television documentary, perform in a marching, jazz or symphonic band, or audition for a play.

University organizations cover a variety of interests. Many clubs are related to academic programs, while others focus on social activities and community service. Sororities and fraternities offer opportunities for social growth, nationwide networking, and philanthropic involvement.
