## AWARD-WINNING ADULT COMEDY OPENS THURSDAY

Lanford Wilson's award-winning adult comedy, "The Hot 1 Baltimore," opens Thursday night to begin the spring semester schedule for theatre by the Department of Performing Arts. Directed by graduate student Bryan C. Reeder, performances are scheduled at 8 p.m. Thursday (a preview showing with tickets specially priced at \$3.00), Friday and Saturday; at 2 p.m. Sunday; and at 8 p.m. March 1-3, with tickets priced from \$5-7. Wilson, a Missouri playwright, scored his first commercial off-Broadway success with the play in 1973. The play later was the basis for the hit television series of the title. ## COMMISSION NAMED TO PLAN SPORTS FESTIVAL

KMOX Radio personalities Dan Dierdorf, former offensive lineman for the Football Cardinals, and Jack Buck, sports director for the CBS affiliate, have been appointed to the Lindenwood College Sports Commission, a nine-member group that will plan an area-wide sports festival this fall at Lindenwood. It is charged with planning a 12-week festival that will feature high school and college football and soccer competitions as well as marching band performances. Lindenwood also will host a collegiate men's and women's soccer tournament in September that will attract teams from leading colleges and universities throughout the midwest.

Other civic and business leaders appointed include Robert F. Hyland, general manager of KMOX-AM and KHTR-FM Radio and regional vice-president of CBS, Inc.; Henry J. Elmendorf, secretary-treasurer of Jim Meagher's Motor Co., St. Charles; Walter L. Metcalfe, Jr., a St. Louis attorney; John C. Harnegan, a St. Charles attorney; and Frank Young, chief of the St. Charles Police Dept.

Lindenwood representatives serving on the commission include President James I. Spainhower, Sydney G. Parrish, Marilyn Morris and Randy L. Wallick. A specific timetable for the fall event and a schedule of competing schools and events will be finalized by commission members and announced shortly.

## ILLUSTRATED LECTURE SET MARCH 9

A gallery talk and illustrated lecture on applique fabrics is scheduled at 4 p.m., March 9, by Janet Berlo, assistant professor of art at the University of Missouri-St. Louis. Open to the public free of charge as well as students, faculty and staff, the event is part of "The Art of Applique," an exhibition of more than 40 applique needlework pieces that opens today at the Harry D.
