### New Leadership for Entrepreneurship

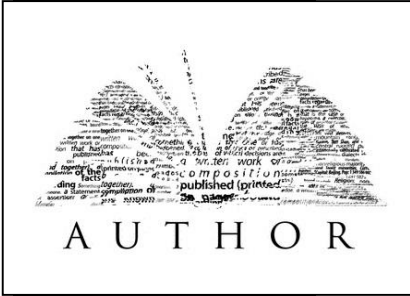

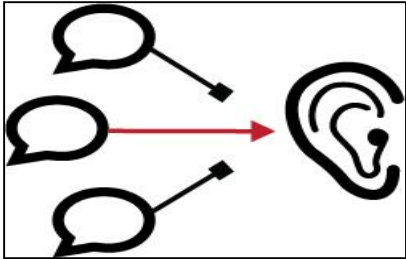
