A native of St. Peters, Mo., Dr. Matt Hoormann is no stranger to the MMEA conference, having participated in multiple Missouri All-State High School Honors Jazz Bands while a student at Fort Zumwalt South High School under Gary Brandes. Zebadiah Briskovich, Bass "Zeb" Briskovich is the top call bassist in the St. Louis region on both electric and acoustic

bass and is known for his versatility and expertise in a wide range of musical genres. Having parents in the music industry, Zeb was always surrounded by music and musicians. Zeb's professional career began at age 10 when he was called to fill in for a bass player who could not make a performance. Zeb knew his calling was to become a professional bassist and he attended SIUE for his bachelor's and master's in music with an emphasis in jazz performance studying the esteemed Tom Kennedy. Currently, Zeb leads the group Rare Departure, which is his own jazzfusion project. As well as performing frequently in the St. Louis music scene, his versatility to play any music style continues to make him one of the most sought-after session players, recording on countless projects.



Adam Donohue, Saxophone Adam Donohue received his Bachelor of Music from Berklee College of Music in

Boston in 1999. He then began an eight-year tenure as a musical director in the cruise line industry. In 2007, he earned a Master of Arts in music from Washington State University with an emphasis in jazz composition and saxophone.

While living in North Carolina, he founded a music production company and toured regionally with a jazz/ funk ensemble called Hot Politics,

who released their first studio album in 2008. He worked as a sound designer for Notion Music Inc., which developed music software, and was later acquired by PreSonus. As chief audio engineer for the American Dance Festival, he oversaw and trained assistant engineers while working with some of the top performers and choreographers in contemporary dance.

He has published several original compositions for jazz orchestra and composes music for dance. Notable performances include playing with Jeff Coffin from the Dave Matthews Band, jazz vocalist Kevin Mahogany, actress/comedienne/guitarist Charo, and John Handy, saxophonist with Charles Mingus.



Adaron Jackson, Piano Pianist, arranger and composer Adaron Jackson has performed as a sideman as well as

with his own ensembles throughout the U.S. and Europe. Having started the piano at the age of 9, he has dedicated his life to music. While in high school, Adaron had the opportunity to perform consistently throughout the U.S. with noted musicians Ellis Marsalis, Arturo Sandoval, Greg Tardy, and Slide Hampton.

"Pops," as he is known locally as well as nationally, maintains an active performing career, playing between 100 and 150 dates a year under his own name and as a freelancer. Adaron has toured throughout the United States with Grammy Award-winning Motown legend The Temptations. He has performed in nearly every major (and minor!) venue in the St. Louis area as well as the Chicago Jazz Festival, the St. Louis Blues and

Heritage Festival, the Smoky River Festival, SLSO Onstage series, and the Kansas City Blues and Jazz Festival.



Larry Johnson, Saxophone Being a professional musician for the last 34 years, Larry Johnson began working as a

professional saxophonist at the age of 13.

Some of the highlights from Larry's career include performing on stage with Dizzy Gillespie, Louie Bellson, and St. Louis musicians Carolbeth True and Jim Manley. Considered a "top call" studio musician in St. Louis, Larry has recorded over 40 times with various people – twice as a leader for the Victoria Jazz label.

Larry is currently entering his 31st year as a middle school band director at St. Joseph School in St. Charles, Mo., where he started the instrumental music program in 1985 with 45 students. He has developed the program into five ensembles with more than 225 members. In addition, he is beginning his 20th year as the jazz band director at St. Dominic High School in O'Fallon, Mo.



Bernard Long, Jr., Drums Bernard Long, Jr. is a talented percussionist who began playing drums at 4 years old. The

late Bernard Long, Sr., sensed his son's love and feel for music and introduced him to the world of music. Bernard Long, Jr., graduated with his bachelor's in music with an emphasis in jazz studies May 2009 from

Northern Illinois University under the leadership of Professor Ron Carter, and from Michigan State University in May 2012 with his master's in music with an emphasis in jazz studies.

Bernard Jr. has studied with the following professors and outstanding percussionists: Robert Chappell, Rich Holly, Greg Beyer, Randy Gelispie, Terreon Gully, Wes "Warm Daddy" Anderson, Carl Allen, Marvin Sparks, and Rodney Whitaker. With the knowledge gained in these great experiences, Bernard Jr. has toured as a drummer on Royal Caribbean and Celebrity Cruise lines and with The World Famous Glenn Miller Orchestra.



Brian Vaccaro, Guitar Brian Vaccaro graduated from Webster University in St. Louis in 1996

with a bachelor's degree in music with an emphasis in jazz studies. He continued his education at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville, where he earned a master's degree in music in jazz guitar performance in 2000. Since completing his studies, Brian has been active as an educator as well as a performer, recording with many of the top musicians in the St. Louis area.

Currently, Brian is the music education director at Mozingo Music in Ellisville and O'Fallon, Mo., managing individual and group lessons, rock band programs, and a regular schedule of visiting artist workshops including artists such as Tommy Emmanuel, Larry Coryell, Tuck Andress, Johnny Hiland, Greg

Koch, and Ernie Isley since 2001.

Going Through the Motions, the debut album by the Brian Vaccaro Trio, was honored to be included in the Notable Releases of 2011 list by noted critic and author W. Royal Stokes.

Brian currently performs in and around the St. Louis area with his own trio and with the band Analog Thief.
