



First of all.

The Lindenwood Colleges are 140 acres of green lawns, hills, stately old trees and ivy-covered, red brick buildings — a scenic campus set in the historic Missouri River city of St. Charles, just minutes from metropolitan St. Louis and its international airport.

The Colleges offer graduate and undergraduate degrees in a co-educational environment. The Lindenwood Colleges are a dynamic and innovative higher-education cluster composed of Lindenwood College for Women, founded in 1827; its coordinate, Lindenwood College for Men; the Evening College; and the College for Individualized Education.

Lindenwood is accredited by The North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and by The National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education.



Lindenwood Students

Undergraduate enrollment at Lindenwood totals approximately 1400 students of which close to half are full time. The remaining 700 students are enrolled for one or more day or evening courses. There are approximately 200 graduate students. The entire student body is almost equally composed of women and men who represent more than half of the states and ten foreign nations.



Lindenwood Faculty

Small classes, close student-faculty relationships and sensitive attention to the needs of each student are important parts of what make an unusually high quality education at Lindenwood. The student to faculty ratio is 12 to 1. Approximately 60 per cent of Lindenwood's faculty hold the doctorate degree in their fields. There are 52 full-time and more than 100 part-time faculty members including many professionals from the St. Louis metropolitan community who bring with them valuable training and current experience in their fields of specialization. A prime example is the private music instruction offered by regular members of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra.



Academic Program

At Lindenwood, a total education combines both a strong liberal arts and sciences program with career-oriented experiences. A wide variety of internships, off-campus studies, independent projects and travel are offered in addition to the traditional liberal arts and sciences curriculum. Programs are people-oriented, interdisciplinary and individually designed whenever possible and appropriate.



The Evening College

Since 1972 Lindenwood's Evening College has provided a wide range of study opportunities for young people and adults of all ages who aren't able to attend daytime classes. Approximately 170 courses are offered each year in the evening with business administration drawing the largest enrollments. In response to the needs of students and the business community in the St. Louis/St. Charles metropolitan area, the Evening College also offers a Master of Business Administration degree which can be completed entirely through evening courses.



The College for Individualized Education

Lindenwood 4, The College for Individualized Education is the newest of the four colleges and is designed for the working adult. Students design their specific study plans with advisers and then carry them out using the resources and support of a learning community which includes faculty, fellow students and specialists in their fields. They meet evenings and weekends in the Lindenwood Centers in Washington, D.C., Santa Monica, California, as well as in St. Louis and St. Charles, Missouri. Many students are able to apply their studies to their work and to use their working situations as a laboratory. All participants in Lindenwood 4 programs are enrolled as full time students.

Lindenwood 4 offers specialized programs at the Master's level in such fields as Art Therapy, Counseling Psychology, Voluntary Association Administration, Theatre Arts, Teacher Education, Gerontology, and Business Administration.



Pre-Professional Programs

Most professional graduate schools require the student to spend two to four years in a liberal arts curriculum preparing for admission. Lindenwood provides guidance and help in planning courses of study for those students interested in the following programs:

Lindenwood also cooperates with Washington University of St. Louis in a 3-2 Engineering program.



Campus Features

Among the facilities of special interest at The Lindenwood Colleges are:

- A professionally equipped Center for the Performing Arts
- A large modern library supplemented by an active loan program among major university, public and corporation libraries and with extensive periodical and microfiche collections
- Modern art galleries and studios (drawing, painting, ceramics, sculpture, printmaking, photography, dance)
- Five residence halls two for men, three for women
- Training center for the St. Louis Cardinals of the National Football League.

Special Program Features

Students will find a number of unique and interesting programs at Lindenwood, a few of which include:

- Off-campus study in this country and abroad, including junior year abroad and special January term
- Cooperative programs with other St. Louis area colleges and universities; American University in Washington, D.C.; Merill-Palmer Institute of Human Development; Argonne National Laboratories
- 1500-watt F.M. student-operated educational radio station serving the campus and the communities of St. Charles and St. Louis
- Extensive horsemanship program
- Private music instruction by members of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra
- A campus school for nursery and kindergarten students offering education majors an opportunity to observe and practice innovations in early childhood education
- Career oriented programs relating job experience and technical training to the traditional liberal arts and sciences
- 4-1-4 calendar plus summer sessions
- 1,000 acre nature preserve in central Missouri available for biological research
- INSERVICE, a cluster of cooperative work-study programs exploring the nature of religious activities in churches and synagogues of many denominations
- Bachelor of Medicine degree, first of its kind in this country, designed to train individuals to be health associates
- The "Electric Chicken," a computer-based model to study the long-term results of biological and psychological variables





Student and Community Life

- Resident students live in spacious dormitories for women and men, with lounges, kitchenettes, laundries, recreation rooms and music practice rooms.
- Students, with assistance from the deans, develop regulations for student life and participate in academic planning.
- Among the extracurricular activities at Lindenwood is a wide variety of organized and informal interest groups, clubs, and honor societies.
- An extensive on-campus calendar of films, concerts, theatre performances, recitals, art exhibits, lectures, and special events is offered throughout the year in addition to activities in St. Charles and St. Louis
- Tennis courts, stables, an all-weather covered riding arena, indoor and outdoor pools, playing fields, a gymnasium, and a new fully-lighted soccer-football field are among the athletic facilities for students at Lindenwood.
- Lindenwood students compete on intercollegiate teams in baseball, basketball, equitation, field hockey, gymnastics, soccer, tennis, national trap and skeet.
- The colleges maintain a fully-equipped health center with a staff of doctors on call. A major hospital is within a few blocks of the campus.
- A bookstore, post office, snack bars and a cafeteria are on campus for students' convenience.
- Lindenwood's concert chorus, madrigal choir and instrumental ensembles perform on and off campus, at home and abroad.

Admission

Lindenwood selects for admission those students who show evidence of ability and scholastic achievement regardless of race, creed, color or national origin. Each undergraduate applicant must have completed 16 academic units in high school with four of these units being in English and the remaining in the areas of foreign language, mathematics, social sciences and science. Applicants should request that their high school transcript be sent directly to the Admissions Office. Candidates for admission should arrange to take the Scholastic Aptitude Test of the College Entrance Examination Board or the American College Test (ACT) offered by the American College Testing Program prior to January of their senior year of high school.

Early Admission


Highly qualified applicants may be considered for admission upon completion of their junior year of high school.

Credit and/or Advanced Placement

Credit or placement is given for scores of 3 or higher on the Advanced Placement Tests of the College Entrance Examination Board. CLEP credits are also accepted.

Transfer Students

Applicants should make sure that transcripts from all colleges attended are forwarded to the Admissions Office.



Application Procedure

- Request an Application for Admission, noting for which one of the four colleges you are applying.
- If possible, arrange for a campus visit and an official interview. For Lindenwood 4 students, planning sessions with a faculty administrator at the regional centers are required as part of the admission procedures.
- 3. Mail the completed Application for Admission form; enclose a check or money order to cover the \$15.00 non-refundable application fee.
- Immediately ask schools and/or colleges you have attended to forward your official transcripts to Lindenwood.
- Be sure that your SAT, ACT, or equivalent test scores are forwarded to Lindenwood.

Costs *

Full-time Students

The charge for tuition, room, board, health and student activity fees is approximately \$4600 a year for dormitory residents. Tuition and fees for full-time commuting students is approximately \$2700 per year. Estimated additional expenses are \$500 per year to include books, transportation and personal expenses.

Part-time Students

Tuition for part-time students is \$180 per course for undergraduates and \$275 for graduate students.

Scholarships And Financial Aid

Students who cannot meet their entire college expense, but show academic promise, may receive assistance in the form of scholarships, grants, loans, campus employment and/or work-study. Most financial aid awards are based on need and scholastic achievement. Each candidate applying for financial aid is required to file the Financial Aid Form (FAF) with the College Scholarship Service or the American College Testing Service. Applicants are also encouraged to apply for the Basic Educational Opportunity Grant. All Missouri financial aid applicants are required to apply for the Missouri Student Grant.
