Women's Basketball Remains Undefeated

Women's basketball rose to 6-0 overall with a 77-68 defeat of McKendree at Hyland Arena. This is the best start for the Lions since joining the NCAA! Sophomore forward Kallie Bildner had her sixth consecutive double-double with 21 points and 11 rebounds, both game highs.



Men's Basketball Forces 23 Turnovers

Men's basketball won its home opener at Hyland Arena with an 86-61 victory over Hannibal-LaGrange. The Lions defense had 13 steals in the game and it forced 23 turnovers. That led to 27 points off turnovers, including 10 that came on fast-break points! The win brought the Lions record to 5-1 in pre-season play. MIAA play starts on Saturday, December 7th.



Women's Volleyball Finishes Season

Senior outside hitter, Alex Dahlstrom recorded 10 kills in the <u>opening round of the MIAA Volleyball</u> Tournament. In the match, the Lions fell to No. 12 Central Oklahoma 3-0. The Lions were eliminated from the MIAA Tournament with a 20-13 overall record! They have already signed 5 new athletes for the 2018 season.
