


Lindenwood University wants you to enjoy your time on campus. The Office of Student Activities exists to serve you by promoting exciting social activities and interactive relationships with other students.





Fax submission results to the attention of your admissions counselor at (636) 949-4989 and sign and mail signature page to him/her. If you have any questions about your SAR (Student Aid Report), please call 1-800-433-3243.
2. Call the Day Admissions Office, (636) 949-4949, one week after you submit your application to be sure all the materials are in for admission evaluation and to schedule a visit and/or campus tour with your admissions counselor.
1. Complete an online application at [www.lindenwood.edu](http://www.lindenwood.edu). Send results of either the ACT or SAT. Lindenwood's code number is 2324 for the ACT and 6367 for the SAT.
- D. Essay, letters of recommendation, and a resume are strongly recommended.
- C. Send results of either the ACT or SAT. Lindenwood's code number is 2324 for the ACT and 6367 for the SAT.
- B. Send official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended. Unofficial transcripts may be faxed to the Day Admissions Office at (636) 949-4989 for preliminary evaluation.
- A. Official transcript, indicating graduation, from the last high school attended. A copy of the student's General Education Development (GED) certificate may be provided to the high school transcript. Transfer students who have successfully completed a two-year program that is in lieu of the high school transcript. Transfer students who have successfully completed a bachelor's degree may not be required to submit their high school transcript.

- B. Send official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended. Unofficial transcripts may be faxed to the Day Admissions Office at (636) 949-4989 for preliminary evaluation.
- A. Official transcript, indicating graduation, from the term goals, or a special experience in your life.
- Include why you wish to further your education, your long-term goals, or attach a personal essay. E faculty members are proud of students and of their success. When a student graduates from one of our many outstanding programs and enters the world outside our gates, he/she represents us. For instance, many of our faculty members utilize the Socratic method as a means of drawing in their students. 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


**V**alues-centered programs leading to the development of the whole person—an educated, responsible citizen of a global community—are central to Lindenwood's mission.

Lindenwood is committed to



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
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**O**ur success is defined by the success of our graduates—in the workplace and in their other endeavors. In a wide variety of disciplines, Lindenwood graduates are respected and trusted in professional life and are leaders in their fields. Preparing students for the workplace and for their future is a highly-qualified faculty of more than 200—an award-winning group of distinguished professionals who make it their mission to know their students' names and help them to reach their fullest potential.

Our most recent incoming class was stellar, with 78 students scoring 30 or more on the ACT test and 73 students who graduated from high school with a perfect 4.0 grade point average. The average first time freshman grade point average was 3.27 and 272 of those graduated with a 3.5 grade point average or better. The average ACT score for first time freshman was 23.06. The class included eleven valedictorians and one salutatorian, as well as 23 Eagle Scouts, 11 Girl Scout Gold Award winners, eight student council presidents, Miss Oklahoma Teen USA, Miss Missouri Teen USA and four Miss Missouri Teen USA finalists.
