MAY COURSE TO TOUR FRANCE, ITALY - A special, off-campus course that will tour France and Italy to probe Medieval and Renaissance art, literature, architecture and music is planned for Lindenwood's May term. To be offered May 20-June 6, the three-credit course "will study Medieval and Renaissance art and architecture as they reflect the pre-Copernican views common to all knowledge in those periods," said James H. Feely, English professor and instructor for the course, "The Discarded Universe."

Alumni and friends of the college can accompany the class and share in the learning experiences as they wish, Feely added. Cost of the 18-day trip is \$1,550, including transportation, lodging based upon double occupancy and contiental breakfasts. Payment must be made by March 15. Registration and payment for course credit must be made through the college's Registrar and Business offices. All travel arrangements have to be made through Fair Winds Travel Agency in St. Charles. If the course is cancelled, all money paid to either the college or the agency will be refunded.
