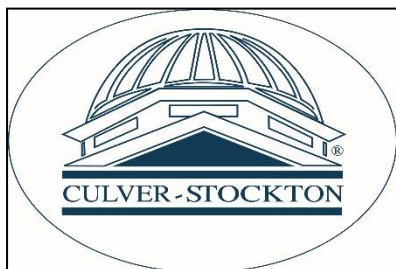

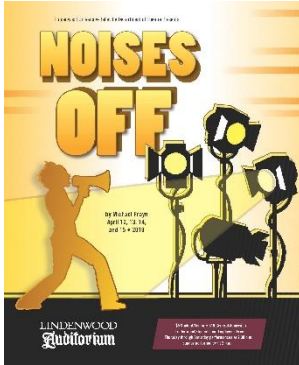
Dr. Shonrock Speaks at Culver-Stockton College

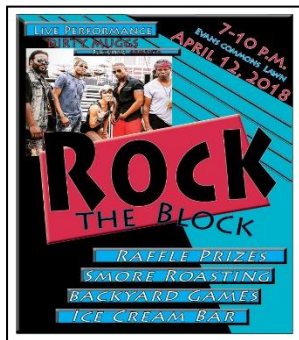
100th Anniversary for Plaster School of Business

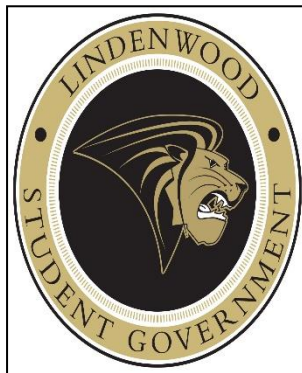
Belleville's Head Swim Coach Has Stellar First Year

Alumnus to Receive Honorary Doctorate Degree



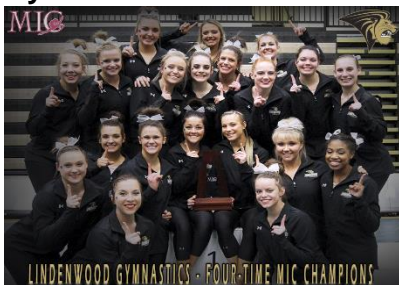
