Admitted Student Preview Day



The baseball team upset No. 18 Central Missouri by a final of 10-2 helping head coach Doug Bletcher earn his 700th-career win! Lindenwood improves to 19-20 on the season and 11-16 in the MIAA.



Hurley Wins Multiple Awards

Allison Hurley, senior attacker for the No. 1 women's lacrosse team was recently selected as both the <u>RMAC</u> <u>Offensive Player of the Week</u> and the <u>IWLCA National</u> <u>Player of the Week!</u> Hurley currently ranks first in program history in points (241) and assists (111), and is third all-time in goals scored (130).



Five Gymnasts Earn All-American Honors

Gymnastics finished its season with a second-place finish and five gymnasts earning <u>All-American honors</u> at the USA Gymnastics Women's Collegiate National Championships! The Lady Lions set program records during the season for wins (26), team regional qualifying score (195.175), and overall national ranking (43rd).



Seven Wrestlers Win All-Academic Honors

The National Wrestling Coaches Association (NWCA) recognized Lindenwood wrestling for its <u>outstanding</u> <u>efforts in the classroom</u> during the 2017-18 season. Lindenwood ranks eighth among the top all-academic Division II schools with a cumulative team GPA of 3.15.



Men's Ruby Defeats Texas A & M

Men's <u>rugby defeated Texas A & M</u> 83-12 in the round of 16 of the USA Rugby D1A Playoffs! The Lions forward pack dominated all phases of play and completely controlled the match from start to finish. With the win, Lindenwood improved to 19-3 and advanced to the quarterfinal round against defending national champion Saint Mary's University.



Women's Rugby Overcomes Mud

Women's rugby faced less than ideal weather, but overcame a pitch covered with mud and the St. Louis Sabres to earn a <u>35-5 victory</u> at Forest Park in St. Louis, MO! Each Lady Lion on the roster was in the lineup for at least a half with six different players scoring seven tries on the day for Lindenwood.
