

Advancement and Communications Launches New Brand Portal

Advancement and Communications is proud to release the updated brand identity for Lindenwood University. The changes in the design are forward-thinking and elegant and reflect modern design sensibilities. Starting today, members of the university community can visit www.lindenwood.edu/brand to access the all new brand portal, which features the new brand guidebook as well as brand elements that offices, individuals, groups, and clubs can use to create various promotional materials. In addition to the brand elements, which are available on the page, we will also be rolling out various templates and examples so that anyone in the university can produce on-brand material.

These updated guidelines are the end result of a collaborative process that included faculty, staff from multiple departments within the university, and current students. Ultimately, the new brand guidelines were approved by the president's cabinet and the Board of Trustees.

Beyond the visual changes, this also marks a change in the Advancement



and Communications process for how projects will be submitted, tracked, and ultimately completed. A Project Request Form is available at www.lindenwood.edu/brand where users can choose from a variety of different project requests, including creative ideation, marketing piece creation, press release and story coordination, item submission to the Digest, and change requests to the website. By filling out the form, users will know exactly what kind of information is needed by Advancement and Communications and the collaborative process to move a project forward can begin. This change will streamline

communication for assistance and greatly help with tracking and prioritization of requests.

Elmes Wins Honorable Mention Award

Melle Ridley Elmes' article, "Public Displays of Affliction: Women's Wounds in Sir Thomas Malory's *Morte Darthur*" (*Modern Philology* 112, 2019, pp. 187-210), has won honorable mention in the Lone Medievalist Prize for Scholarship. In addition, Elmes's first book of poetry, *Arthurian Things: A Collection of Poems*, has won the *World of Myth Magazine* Open Contract challenge, which consisted of a blind-juried process over several entry rounds, with the final grand prize round adjudicated by a different set of judges. The collection will be published in print and electronic formats on all traditional seller platforms (Amazon, Barnes & Noble, etc.) by Dark Myth Publications. Elmes has also been

invited to the Pop Culture Expo in February to give a talk and do book signings as part of this award.

Meet and Greet Hosted by The School of Sciences and The Public Health Student Association




The School of Health Sciences and the Public Health Student Association will host host several SLU graduate programs on campus on Wednesday Sept. 18, from 6
