#### Cottrell Hired as Intern in UNODC

Kaitlin Cottrell (International Business/Gender Studies, 2016) was recently hired as an intern at the UNODC (United Nations Office of Drugs and Crime) in Austria working in their Gender Office. She credits her Gender Studies minor as one of the main reasons she was invited to interview. Kaitlin's internship responsibilities include writing reports, newsletters, and social media posts about the importance of gender mainstreaming and the empowerment of women. Kaitlin will also learn how the UN implements policies and systems that deal with international drug trafficking, human trafficking, terrorism, drug abuse, and cybercrime.

In a recent conversation with Dr. Heather Brown-Hudson, Cottrell said, "The Gender Studies minor prepared me for an international internship at this global organization by giving me the tools to view the world from a perspective that questions societal norms surrounding gender and emphasizes the importance of women's empowerment around the world. Because of this, I am now able to assist my organization in gender mainstreaming on a global scale and help make real change happen."


