Safe Driving Practices

The Office of Public Safety & Security would like to provide the university community with a few tips to promote safe driving practices on campus and elsewhere. Vehicle crashes can lead to costly expenses, serious injuries, and death. The following tips may be practiced to help promote a safer campus environment.

- 1. The speed limit on the St. Charles campus is 15 mph. Please adhere to the speed limit while driving on campus.
- 2. Come to a complete stop at all stop signs before moving on, regardless of whether or not you see crossing traffic or pedestrians at the intersection.
- 3. Do not drive distracted, such as by texting or posting with your phone. Distracted driving is often a contributing factor in automobile accidents.
- 4. Keep a safe driving distance between your vehicle and the vehicle in front of you. Allow enough space to react to sudden stops or other unexpected actions by the vehicle in front of you.
- 5. Be aware of other vehicles and pedestrians in your area.
- 6. Wear a seat belt while operating a motor vehicle.

Please practice these safety tips while operating a motor vehicle and help to promote a safer environment for our university community members and guests.

Workshop: "Dis"abilities or Different Abilities?




Elder and Leavitt Host Podcast

Common Sense Economics for Educators Workshop

On Friday, Oct. 4, the Economic Education Center will offer a unique workshop to train up to 30 educators. The workshop will be held in Dunseth Auditorium, Harmon Hall, at Lindenwood University. The workshop targets SOE faculty, adjuncts, graduate students, and alumni. Participants will strengthen their understanding of economics and receive innovative resources, practical classroom applications, and standards-based lessons for different grade levels. The workshop will equip educators to help students understand their world and make wise choices by developing students' critical thinking, higher-order analytical skills, and life skills. Drs. Tawni Hunt Ferrarini and Grant Black, directors of the Economic Education Center, will lead the training. To encourage access to the training, the workshop is offered at no cost and substitute teacher pay reimbursement is available to the school districts of participating teachers.

Financial Fitness for Life Workshops

The need to train young people in personal finance is well recognized. In response, Missouri requires personal finance education for high school graduation, and Illinois has recently added personal finance standards to its curriculum. These workshops will help educators discover the nationally acclaimed Financial Fitness for Life curriculum resources, including its new online educational technology tools. The workshops are open to local high school teachers, administrators, curriculum coordinators, and School of Education faculty, alumni, and students. Financial Fitness for Life strengthens students' analytical skills by engaging students through active learning compatible with different learning styles. Its lessons are based on relevant concepts and real-world decisions faced by students. Participants will receive a free copy of the *Financial Fitness for Life Teacher Guide Grades 9-12*. To encourage access to the training, the workshop is offered at no cost and substitute teacher pay reimbursement is available to the school districts of participating teachers.
