HeinOnline is a premier online database containing more than 170 million pages and 200,000 titles of historical and government documents in a fully searchable, image-based format.



The database provides topic-specific databases, including all of the world's constitutions, all U.S. treaties, collections of classic treatises and presidential documents, Criminal Justice, Religion and the Law, and Women and the Law, among others.

Professor Ferrarini Speaks at Princeton University



On Sept. 30, <u>Dr. Tawni Hunt Ferrarini</u> spoke at <u>The Princeton Tory Dinner</u> in the Chancellor Green Library on the campus of Princeton University in Princeton, NJ. Ferrarini, the Robert W. Plaster Professor of Economic Education, was invited to lecture on the topic of today's tensions between political and market forces.

"The Princeton Tory is their leading publication of conservative thought, so this was truly a great experience and will likely lead to future campus visits," she said.

Ferrarini also serves as the associate director of the <u>Hammond</u> <u>Institute for Free Enterprise</u> and as director of the <u>Economic</u> <u>Education Center</u> at Lindenwood University.




campus integration, and bring a professional delivery of service to all university stakeholders.

The Public Health Student Association and the School of Health Sciences are hosting guest speakers on campus to discuss gun violence in St. Louis. This event is designed to appeal to many students and faculty:

- Social workers as they serve the community and focus on reducing repeat violence.
- Business and health management/administration as we hear how the director of trauma at St. Louis Children's Hospital changed policies/protocol to improve operations.
- Pre-medicine and pre-nursing to hear how doctors and nurses respond to the emergencies in real time.
- Public Health as we look at the issue from the perspective of systematic and social determinants of health perspective.
- Anybody and everybody who is aware of the increase of gun violence in our region this past summer, especially with children as victims.
