Parking Lots and Roads to Close for Homecoming Events and Parade

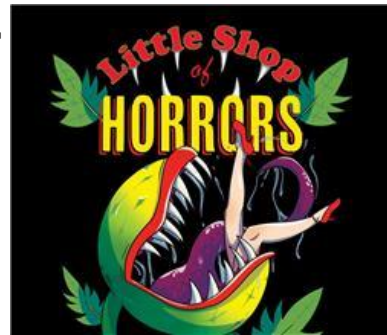
In order to prepare for the upcoming Homecoming activities, a number of parking

Memorial Service Set for Dr. C. Greg Anderson

A memorial service for Dr. C. Greg Anderson will be held at 3 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 8, in the Lindenwood University Cultural Center auditorium at 400 N. Kingshighway. Dr. Anderson, who taught biology in the School of Sciences, passed away on the evening of Oct. 1 after suffering a heart attack. A fund has been created to support and maintain the Missouri Native Plant Conservation Garden in the name of Dr. Anderson. In addition to ongoing support of the garden, located adjacent to Young Hall, a memorial plaque honoring Dr. Anderson will be installed utilizing funds received. Dr. Anderson was an associate professor of biology at Lindenwood University from 2010 to 2019. He earned his Bachelor of Science in biology from the University of Missouri-Columbia and a Ph.D. in ecology and evolutionary biology from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. He worked as a research assistant in the Division of Mammals at the National Museum of Natural History at the Smithsonian Institution before attending graduate school and taught courses at the university level for 20 years in a variety of subjects, including biology, anatomy, physiology, and evolution.



His research interests included mammals (primarily otters and other carnivores) and riparian habitat restoration, and he performed extensive field research with undergraduate students in habitat restoration at Lindenwood's Boone Home site for several years. Dr. Anderson served at various times as a department chair and a member of the Faculty Council, and he also served in the United States Navy.
