EDWARDS NAMED TO STATE TASK FORCE

Phil Edwards, director of off-campus facilities in downtown St. Louis and near West Port Plaza, is one of 16 individuals in the state named to the Governor's Crime Commission Task Force on Boating Safety. Formed recently by Gov. Christopher S. Bond, the task force is charged with formulating recommendations by November 1 on how state laws should be strengthened to reduce drunken boating and to increase boating safety on Missouri waters. Edwards also serves as an adjunct professor of business administration at the West Port and Mansion House centers.
