SPAINHOWER NAMED TO STATEWIDE GROUP

THE MISSOURI CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AND THE STATE TEACHERS ASSOCIATION HAVE APPOINTED PRESIDENT JAMES I. SPAINHOWER TO THE MISSOURI EDUCATION/BUSINESS PARTNERS, A GROUP DESIGNED TO STRENGTHEN BUSINESS AND EDUCATIONAL COOPERATION IN MISSOURI. AS THE ONLY COLLEGE PRESIDENT IN THE STATE NAMED TO THE GROUP, SPAINHOWER WILL REPRESENT THE EDUCATION FACTOR ON THE GROUP'S BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

EARNING NATIONAL RECOGNITION AS A CONCERT GUITARIST, NEWMAN HAS PERFORMED AT COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY CAMPUSES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY AS WELL AS AT CARNEGIE HALL AND WITH THE ATLANTA, SEATTLE, CLEVELAND AND HONOLULU SYMPHONY ORCHESTRAS. IN ORDER TO CONTINUE QUALITY WORK ON A TIMELY BASIS, ALL SMALL DUPLICATING JOBS (WITH THE EXCEPTION OF XEROXING), NOW REQUIRE A MINIMUM OF ONE-DAY (24-HOUR) NOTICE, SAID LARRY ELAM, VICE-PRESIDENT OF FINANCE. ELAM SAID LARGER JOBS WILL NOW REQUIRE A NOTICE OF ONE-WEEK OR MORE DEPENDING UPON SIZE AND QUANTITY NEEDED. ELAM ATTRIBUTES THIS CHANGE TO THE INCREASED VOLUME OF WORK ORDERS REQUIRED FROM THE DUPLICATING DEPARTMENT.
