BATIK EXHIBIT AT HENDREN GALLERY

AN EXHIBIT OF BATIK WALL HANGINGS BY HELEN TURNER, A KANSAS CITY ARTIST, WILL BE ON DISPLAY NOW THROUGH NOVEMBER 30 AT THE HARRY D. HENDREN GALLERY IN THE FINE ARTS BLDG. BATIK IS AN INDONESIAN METHOD OF HAND-PRINTING TEXTILES BY COATING PARTS NOT TO BE DYED WITH WAX. TURNER EMPLOYS THE TRADITIONAL TECHNIQUE OF THE CRAFT TO CREATE ABSTRACT-DESIGNED FABRICS WHICH ARE ASSEMBLED ONTO WALL HANGINGS. TURNER, WHO HAS EXHIBITED EXTENSIVELY IN THE KANSAS CITY AREA, IS A PROFESSOR OF ART AND ART HISTORY AT MAPLE WOODS COMMUNITY COLLEGE IN KANSAS CITY.
