THE REV. GEORGE R. WILCOX HAS BEEN NAMED CHAPLAIN AT LINDENWOOD AND ASSISTANT PASTOR AT ST. CHARLES PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH. IN THE NEWLY-CREATED POSITION AT LINDENWOOD, WILCOX WILL SERVE AS A COUNSELOR TO STUDENTS, FACULTY AND STAFF AND AS CHAIRMAN OF THE RELIGIOUS LIFE COUNCIL ON CAMPUS.

A 1984 GRADUATE OF PRINCETON THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY IN NEW JERSEY, WILCOX HOLDS UNDERGRADUATE AND MASTER'S DEGREES IN DIVINITY FROM WITTENBERG UNIVERSITY IN OHIO. WILCOX HAS SERVED AS CHAPLAIN TO THE MERWICK REHABILITATION CENTER IN PRINCETON, NJ; INTERSHIPS AT THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN MT. CLEMENS, MI, AND WALLINGFORD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN WALLINGFORD, PA; AS AN ASSISTANT CHAPLAIN AT GEISINGER MEDICAL CENTER IN DANVILLE, PA; AND AS AN ORDERLY AT PORTER MEMORIAL HOSPITAL IN DENVER.
