
THE CONSOLIDATED ADVISING PROGRAM






THE SAINT LOUIS AREA: OPPORTUNITY AT YOUR DOORSTEP








Small means involved. Our 10:1 student/faculty ratio means that you will get all the personal attention you need. The smaller class size allows the Lindenwood professors time to become personally involved in their students' progress. COMMUNICATIONS:

"Hands-on!" is the Communications Department credo. Freshmen don't have to wait in line behind upperclassmen to get their chance to gain experience. Majors include: Mass Communication (Including Radio, Television, Journalism, and Public Relations) as well as Corporate and Industrial Communications. KCLC-FM, our recently expanded on-campus stereo facility, is the principal radio station in St. Charles County. New radio and color television production and broadcasting equipment, as well as studio and dark-room facilities, complete the array of facilities.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION:

The department offers major and minor concentrations in Business Administration. These include: Accounting, Economics, Fashion Marketing, Finance, Management, Management Information Systems, and Marketing. The St. Louis area is one of the most vital business communities in the nation. Consequently, the business internship program at Lindenwood offers excellent opportunities for linking theory with practice in the corporate environment.



BIOLOGY:

If you are planning to major or minor in Biology, you may take courses from several curricular areas including Molecular and Cellular Biology, Organic Biology, Comparative Biology, and Environmental Biology. The Biology Department also offers a major in Medical Technology. Field work in Biology often is conducted at the nearby nature preserve in the Cuivre River area. Modern laboratories, equipment, and computers facilitate your studies in Biology.










HE PRIMARY ASSET OF ANY COLLEGE: PEOPLE!

FINANCIAL AID AND ADMISSIONS

You probably have questions. We have the answers.



Q. How expensive is Lindenwood?

A. That depends on a number of factors. Approximately 85% of the student body receives some form of financial assistance through grants, scholarships, and loans. The average amount of financial aid is about \$4,000 per year—reducing the cost to that of most state schools!

Q. How do I find out if I qualify for financial assistance?

A. Fill out a FFS (Family Financial Statement) — using code #2324 to indicate that your information is to be sent to Lindenwood College—and mail it to:

Q. How do I apply to Lindenwood?

A. We'll supply you with an application as soon as we have received the reply card. Your application will get our individual attention. To evaluate your application we'll need the following items:

- The completed application form
- A check for \$25 to cover your application fee
- A copy of your high school transcript
- Scores from your ACT or SAT tests
- It's also a good idea for you to visit the campus for a personal interview with one of our admissions counselors

Q. How do I apply for scholarships, grants and loans?

A. We'll put a financial aid package together which is tailored to your individual needs. Lindenwood offers a variety of scholarships and grants, based on financial need and/or academic achievement as demonstrated by your academic performance in high school and your ACT or SAT test scores.



Q. When should I begin?

A. Now. Many scholarships and Federal and State grants are distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. Don't be left out!


