Dear Friends:






Lindenwood University wants you to enjoy your time on campus. The Office of Student Activities exists to serve you by promoting exciting social activities and interactive relationships with other students.



TOP ACADEMICS

Admission to Lindenwood University is based upon a review of the applicant's previous academic and life experience. The university will review the applicant's previous high school and/or university course work and ACT/SAT scores. The university suggests an interview with an admissions counselor who individually evaluates each applicant.

Undergraduate Admission Instructions

1. Complete an online application at www.lindenwood.edu or mail the application in this booklet with the non-refundable \$30 application fee. Attach a personal resume indicating your community service, youth leadership, clubs, organizations and non-academic experiences and essay. Your personal essay may include why you wish to further your education, your longterm goals, or a special experience in your life.

The applicant's file must also include:

A. Official transcript, indicating graduation, from the Education Development (GED) certificate may be provided

B. Send official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended. Unofficial transcripts may be faxed to the admissions office at 636-949-4989 for preliminary evaluation.

last high school attended. A copy of the student's General in lieu of the high school transcript. Transfer students who have successfully completed a two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree may not be required to submit their high school transcripts.

C. Send results of either the ACT or SAT, Lindenwood's code number is 2324 for the ACT and 6367 for the SAT. Transfer students with 24 or more hours of credit and applicants who have been out of high school for five or more years may not be required to furnish scores from standardized tests, although they are recommended. Satisfactory standardized test scores are required for all students majoring in education.

D. Letters of recommendation are welcome and encouraged, but NOT required.

2. Call the Undergraduate Admissions Office, 636-949-4949 one week after you submit your application to be sure all the materials are in for admission evaluation and to schedule a visit and/or campus tour with your admissions counselor.


3. Complete a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov to apply for need-based aid. The LU school code is 002480. Remember to click print because that is what submits your application. Fax submission results to the attention of your admissions counselor at 636-949-4989 and sign and mail signature page to him/her. If you have any questions about your SAR (Student Aid Report) please call 1-800-433-3243.

4. When the application, transcripts, test scores and FAFSA information have been evaluated, you will receive a letter indicating your admission status. Your admission is not complete until all official documents are received. If you have questions, please call 636-949-4949.





ON A MISSION




Lindenwood is not only a national leader in the number of intercollegiate athletic opportunities it provides its student-athletes, but also in the number of national titles that it has collected. Lindenwood's talented student-athletes, first-class coaches and some of the finest facilities available combine to create a championship atmosphere.

Lindenwood has won 33 national championships, with 32 of those coming since the 2001-02 school year. Eleven different Lindenwood programs have contributed to those titles, including several perennial champions.


The Lions are the envy of the roller hockey nation, as they have dominated the highest collegiate level of the sport and won seven straight national championships. The last five years, that program has also captured the national title in the JV division.

Lindenwood shooting is also the finest in the country, winning five straight national crowns and boasting a team member on the 2008 U.S. Olympic team.

Lindenwood wrestling is always near the top of the team standings at the NAIA Championship, winning four national championships and having two runner-up finishes over the last seven years.







Our success is defined by the success of our graduates—in the workplace and in their other endeavors. In a wide variety of disciplines, Lindenwood graduates are respected and trusted in professional life and are leaders in their fields. Preparing students for the workplace and for their future is a highly-qualified faculty of more than 200—an award-winning group of distinguished professionals who make it their mission to know their students' names and help them to reach their fullest potential.

Our most recent freshman class was stellar, with 45 students scoring 30 or more on the ACT test and 50 students who graduated from high school with a perfect 4.0 grade point average. One hundred students were in the top 10 percent of their graduating classes, and 150 graduated with a 3.6 grade point average or better. The class included six valedictorians and five salutatorians, as well as 19 Eagle Scouts, 11 Girl Scout Gold Award winners, eight student council presidents, Miss Oklahoma Teen USA, and six Miss Missouri Teen USA finalists.
