Instruction in either of the Ancient or Modern Languages,	10 00
Drawing, Crayoning, Painting, (Greecian or Water Colors,) each,	10 00
Painting in Oil,	20 00

One-third of 10 months' charges payable in September, one-third in January and the remainder in April. No pupil retained unless terms strictly complied with.

The first term of 5 months begins the 14th of September; the second term, the 1st day of February.
