Forum on Voting and Political Participation Scheduled

Lindenwood University will host a forum titled "You don't vote, but you should," including a distinguished panel of scholars and community leaders on March 3 at 3:30 p.m. in the Spellmann Center's Anheuser-Busch Leadership Room to discuss why the 2020 election could be the most significant in a generation.

The panel will discuss barriers to political participation, ways to overcome these barriers, and why the election this November could influence voting choices for the next decade.

Panel members include Kurt Bahr, director of the St. Charles County Election Authority and former member of the Missouri House of Representatives; Don Heidenreich, Lindenwood University history professor; Anita Manion, UMSL assistant professor of political science; and Dave Robertson, UMSL curators' teaching professor and chair of the political science department.

The event is free and open to the public.

John Wehmer (1927-2019)

Professor Emeritus of Art at Lindenwood University, John Wehmer, passed away

on December 30, 2019. John was born in St. Louis in 1927. He served in the US Navy during World War II and on returning studied art at the University of Missouri and then Washington University. John taught in the Art Department at Lindenwood from 1959 to 1992. He mentored many students and junior faculty members and his paintings were recognized and exhibited in many locations in the U.S. and he was part of a thriving arts scene in the



mid-20th century. He developed a style of abstraction that was expressive and symbolic based on his own experiences. John took many Lindenwood students to Mexico to visit the monuments and art works there. During the summers he lived in a cabin in Colorado and painted many naturalistic scenes in the mountain areas.

A memorial service for John Wehmer will be held on Saturday, March 7, from 2 to 5 p.m. at the Lindenwood University Cultural Center (LUCC) at 400 N. Kingshighway, St. Charles, MO 63301.
