National Search Will be Held for Plaster School Dean

As the search continues for a permanent replacement for Dean Roger Ellis after his retirement this summer, the Lindenwood University administration has elected to launch a nationwide search for a new dean in the fall of this year.

"The decision to assemble the highest-caliber dean candidates through a nationwide search befits the stature and prominence of the Plaster School of Business & Entrepreneurship," said Deb Ayres, vice president for human resources. "We are confident that at the conclusion of the process, we will have a dean who can take the school to the next level."

Between Ellis' departure and the installation of a permanent replacement, Molly Hudgins will serve as interim dean of the school. Hudgins has had a long history with the Plaster School of Business as a faculty member and assistant dean before taking her current job as associate provost for experiential curriculum and learning in 2019.

"With her background and commitment to academic excellence and to the students of Lindenwood University, I am confident the school will be in good hands under Molly's leadership," Ayres said. "I would like to thank those who have served on the search committee to this point. We appreciate the fine work you've done during the process."

Dr. Grant Black Presents at Missouri Council for the Social Studies

Grant Black, Ph.D., associate professor of economics and associate director of the economic education center, presented "Election Economics" on Feb. 22 at the 2020 Conference of the Missouri Council for the Social Studies held at the Missouri History Museum.

The session addressed how educators can bring the excitement and issues of a major election year into the classroom and empower students to be good decision-makers as citizens. The session highlighted how to use current and historical issues related to elections to



stimulate student learning while showing how economics can explain voter behavior, election outcomes, and the effects of government policies.

Participants learned how to use economic reasoning to explore hot topics like free trade, immigration, minimum wages, taxes, and government spending. Black also introduced participants to a wide range of multimedia resources ready for use in the classroom. This presentation supports the Economic Education Center's mission as a part of the Hammond Institute to increase economic literacy in part through professional development for educators.

Dr. Jeanie Thies Quoted on St. Louis Public Radio Regarding Voting Rights in Missouri

<u>Jeanie Thies</u>, Ph.D., professor of political science, was quoted last week in a segment on St. Louis Public Radio, titled <u>More Than 6,000</u> <u>Missourians on Probation or Parole Can't Vote</u> – Some Want to Lift the Ban. When Missouri holds its presidential primaries next month, more than 63,000 residents will be barred from participating because they've been convicted of a felony and are serving a sentence on probation and parole. Some state lawmakers are hoping to lift the voting ban, and have sponsored legislation to allow people on criminal supervision to vote.

According Thies, a 2018 report from the Department of Corrections shows around 60 percent of people on probation and parole have a job.

"Most others are required to be in school or looking for a job as a condition of their supervision," she said.

Thies, who formerly worked with parolees in Missouri, also serves as a program coordinator in the <u>Hammond Institute</u>, where she is responsible for the <u>Criminal Justice Reform Initiative</u>.
