A WAY TO AVOID ANXIETY - Dealing with independence and interpersonal relationships, defining values and goals and facing ongoing challenges can produce anxiety and stress. Add reports and projects, final exams and the holidays, and the pressures can become overwhelming.

To help handle these problems that may be interfering with your personal and academic well being, the CAP Center is implementing the Peer Counseling Program. Peer counselors (Denise Hakenewerth, Kathi Jackson, Audrey Meyer, Lisa Morris, Deanna Rasch and Yvonne Rocco) have completed a seven-week training course in communication skills, developmental issues and crisis-intervention theory. They are available for individual sessions or group discussions. Group discussions are held from 8-9:30 p.m. on Mondays and from 3:30-5 p.m. on Wednesday. Individual sessions are held Mondays from 2:35-3:45 p.m. and 7-8 p.m.; on Tuesdays from 11:20 a.m. to 1:25 p.m., 3-5 p.m. and 7:30-9:30 p.m.; on Wednesdays from 1-3:30 p.m. and 7-9:30 p.m.; on Thursdays from 3-5 p.m. and 7:30-9:30 p.m.; and on Fridays from 10:15-11:30 a.m. and 7-9:30 p.m. at the CAP Center. Got a problem or want to talk? Then, give the Peer Counseling Program a try. And, remember, anything discussed with peer counselors at the CAP Center is confidential.
