# IT Announcement – CAMS System Upgrade and Downtime

Sunday, 6/21/20 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

On Sunday, June 21, Lindenwood will be performing an upgrade of the CAMS student information system. During the outage windows, all features of CAMS, the Priam report server, the application portal, student portal, and faculty/staff portal be inaccessible. Access to all other IT services, including the website, network, Wi-Fi, Canvas, Workday, and email will be unaffected by this outage. The update will be completed by Sunday June 21, at 5 p.m.

## New Partnership Between the Economic Education Center and Youth Entrepreneurs

The School of Education's <u>Economic Education Center</u> has begun partnering with <u>Youth Entrepreneurs</u> (YE) to help high schools in the St. Louis area integrate YE programs into their curriculum. YE is a Kansas-based nonprofit that provides high school students, particularly at-risk students, with business and entrepreneurial education and experiences. Grant Black, associate director of the Economic Education Center, will be coordinating the partnership.

According to its web site, YE "equips young people with the values and vision to pursue their dreams. We strive to change the mindsets of young people, so they believe in themselves and what they can accomplish. Our experiential education model instills



entrepreneurial and economic principles built for prosperity."

The partnership is being kicked off with the help of a generous gift to YE from John Hammond, a member of Lindenwood's Board of Trustees and founder of the Hammond Institute for Free Enterprise in the Plaster School of Business and Entrepreneurship. Hammond has been instrumental in bringing the YE curriculum into the area, having provided the funding to YE for entrepreneurship courses this past school year at Hazelwood West High School (see picture).



- Serve as a university-wide consultant for technology and process improvement.

Non-faculty employees will be given priority consideration for Employee Fellow positions. Applications for Faculty Fellows will be open in the spring.

This cycle is offered for general guidance and may be adjusted as the needs of the program dictate.

- Applications open: June 15-July 15
- Fellows chosen: Mid-August
- Following Academic Year: Ongoing development and implementation of projects, with engagement of colleagues throughout
