Elmes Signs Contract with Routledge Press

Together with her co-editor Dr. Kristin Bovaird-Abbo (English, University of Northern Colorado) Dr. Melissa Ridley Elmes (English/School of Humanities) has signed a contract with Routledge press to publish an edited collection titled *Food and Feast in Premodern Outlaw Tales* with their "Outlaws in Literature, History and Culture" series. In addition to co-authoring the introduction and editing the volume's other contributions, Elmes contributes a chapter to this volume titled "Acting Out(law): Feasts, Outlawry, and Identity Constructions in Two Shakespearean Comedies." The book is scheduled for publication in early 2020. An abstract appears below.

Abstract: In Food and Feast in Premodern Outlaw Tales, editors Melissa Ridley Elmes and Kristin Bovaird-Abbo bring together twelve original essays that span the medieval period through the seventeenth century and cover the Middle English and French literary traditions in romance, chronicle, ballad, courtesy books, cookbooks, and drama. Ranging from Beowulf to the works of John Fletcher, from the French Arthurian prose romances to The Apparition of Master Jean de Meun, the essays in this volume showcase the widespread presence and importance, and critical potential, of food and feasting scenes in premodern outlaw narratives. This volume's focus on the presence and function of food and feast in outlaw narratives from the premodern period allows its readers to reflect further upon whether and how instances of food preparation and eating in these tales can be

read as displaying, developing, or subverting the conventional ideas of community and fellowship most commonly associated with food and feasting.

Drs. Singer, Townsend Publish Op-Ed Article on Trade Deficits

Workday Tip

Tax season is almost here! Help save paper by opting to receive your W2's electronically. All it takes is 4 simple steps.

- 1. Log in to Workday and select the pay worklet
- 2. Under my statements, click tax documents
- 3. Click *edit* under the printing election
- 4. Select receive an *electronic copy of my year-end tax documents* and submit the changes!

Once W2's become available, employees will simply need to access Workday in order to view, print, or download their W2s. Belleville employees will need to opt-in for both companies listed.
